Washington, December 7.—The general
debate in the house on the bankruptcy
bill closed this afternoon, and, be-
forehanding the passage of the bill by

system of bankruptcy, in order to test

Colonel Oates says he will resist the
attempt to secure a vote on the substitute
bill. His bill has been amended. The
bankruptcy bill has undoubtedly lost much
ground during the progress of the debate
and its opponents say it will be badly
beaten. Colonel Oates still maintains
that it can be brought to a vote if
it will pass.

During the morning hour, a resolution
authorizing additional clerical force for
the house aroused some opposition from
Messrs. Bayers and Kilgore, and Mr. Can-
non of Illinois took occasion to chide and
reproach the democratic side with back-
sliding in their pledges of retrenchment
and reform. The resolution, however,
passed.

Upon the announcement of the expiration
of the morning hour, the house re-
solved itself into a committee of the whole
for further consideration of the bankruptcy
bill.

Mr. Easley of Texas, in charge of the
