## BARRS CASE IS CALLED

BOTH SIDES ANNOUNCE READY FOR TRIAL WHEN CASE OF THE STATE VS. JOHN BARRS WAS CALLED IN DISTRICT COURT.

The case of John Barrs, wherein the defendant is charged by the state with rape, was called for trial in the district court this morning, Judge B. H. Gardner presiding. Both sides announced ready for trial, and the

early hour this morning at the Kings Daughters Hospital, where he had been taken for medical treatment after receiving emergency treatment at the office of Dr. R. W. Barton. This is the first really serious accident to occur by reason of the use of autos or motorcycles in Temple. In the excitement Mr. McCarley lost control of his machine and it climbed the curb and dashed against the unfortunate young man, pinning him against the tree, and stopped. The car, being a very heavy one, required a number of men to lift it from the breast of the still conscious man. At the hospital it was found that he had suffered serious internal injuries and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Lawrence, of Troy, were summoned and were at his side when death relieved him of his suffering. Mr. McCarley, with a number of men, ran to his assistance when he was caught, but their combined strength could not budge the car and they had to wait until other men ran to their aid.
