J. B. GATES KILLED.

Death Caused By Accidental Discharge of Rifle While Hunting.

Groveton, Texas, Aug. 9.—J. B. Gates, a prominent citizen of Groveton, accidentally shot and killed himself yesterday while out hunting. He had gone to the woods in company with a party of friends, one of whom says he heard the report of Gates' rifle and went to see what he had killed and found Gates in a dying condition, with one side of his head blown off. The circumstances surrounding the place of the accident go to show that Gates had set the gun against a tree and was in the act of sitting down when the gun fell and exploded. Gates was universally loved and respected throughout the county and his untimely demise cast a gloom over the community.
