CRIMINAL NEGLIGENCE

MAY BE CHARGED AGAINST THE OFFICERS OF GRAND TRUNK RAILROAD, FOLLOWING DISASTROUS COLLISION.

(Herald Special.)
Durand, Mich., Aug. 26.—With the Grand Trunk railroad officials and the county and state officials making independent investigations of the wreck near Duffield yesterday, in which six Pullman passengers were killed, eight injured, three of them probably fatally, it became evident today that stringent action will follow. Chairman Glasgow of the state railroad commission today declared the Grand Trunk officials will be prosecuted if it is found that they were employing incompetent men in violation of the commission's orders against incompetent strike-breakers. Secretary Kelley is conducting the investigation for the commission. Brakeman Graham of the Montreal express, hauling the ill-fated Pullman, is a strike-breaker, and was held over after the strike settlement. Graham declares that he was performing the duty of the rear brakeman at the time of the collision.

FIFTY THOUSAND PEOPLE

Saw the Start in the Stock Chassis Races, Under Auspices of Elgin Automobile Association.

Elgin, Ill., Aug. 26.—More than fifty thousand people were banded in the grand stand and perched on fences today when Starter Fred Wagner released Al Livingston, driving a National car, in the first Illinois trophy race, under the auspices of the Elgin Automobile Road Race Association. All cars were lined up before Livingston started at 10 o'clock. Eight cars started in the race.

Seven cars started in the Kansas country trophy, a distance of 169.46 miles. Six contestants are entered in the Fox River trophy. New records in endurance tests are expected owing to the ideal weather conditions. The road is protected by the militia and the course has been oiled to prevent dust. The drivers entered are known for their speed and endurance. These national stock chassis races are the most important that the west will see this year.

New Orleans, La., Aug. 26.—Special guards were today placed in the cell occupied by Katherine Fretch, the slayer of her faithless lover, to prevent her making further efforts to commit suicide. When advised late last night that she would not be permitted to view the body of Frank Mischeler, her lover, she gouged herself with a safety pin. Guards prevented her from doing violence to herself. Earlier she had tried to stab herself with a hat pin.
