For Palestine and vicinity until 7 p. m. Thursday: Tonight and Thursday generally fair weather. Minimum temperature, 68. Maximum temperature, 92.

Weather Conditions.

A disturbance of moderate energy is passing out to sea off the New England coast, attended by rain in the North Atlantic states. An area of low pressure which is entering the United States from the British northwest territory is causing rain in the northwest. Slight depressions are over Arizona and Utah. Light rains have fallen in Kansas and Missouri. There has been a change to warmer weather in the North Pacific states and the northern Rocky mountain region and temperatures are slightly higher in most of the southern states. The weather is clear in Texas this morning with the exception of some cloudiness in the northern portion of the state. Generally fair weather is indicated for this vicinity tonight and Thursday.

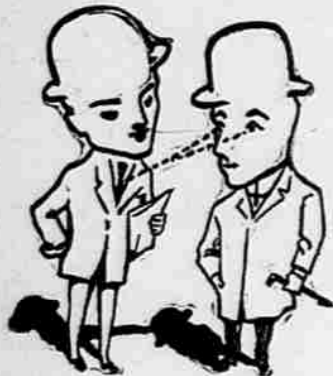
