## A HEAD-ON COLLISION 21 PEOPLE LOST LIVES

**LIGHT EXTRA RUNNING NORTH AND SPECIAL SOUTH BOUND FREIGHT COLLIDE NEAR GOULD SUNDAY MORNING.**

Sunday morning at 10:16 an engine and caboose running north as extra freight No. 213, in charge of Conductor W. B. Riley and Engineer Ralph Turner, and extra freight No. 218, running south, collided near Gould station, on the north end, smashing both engines, destroying three cars, and derailing and damaging five other cars. Three of the crew of the extra light freight were slightly injured.

Engineer Turner had his left shoulder bruised and sprained; not serious. Fireman B. A. Harris suffered a sprained back.

Brakeman A. O. Holmes received a light sprain in his right shoulder.

It is charged that the collision was caused by the crew of the north bound train running by their orders and failing to stop and meet the south bound train at Gould.

The damage to equipment is estimated at \$9000.

None of the injured are seriously hurt, and the wrecker soon had the track open to traffic.

**SEVEN MORE BODIES.** (Herald Special.)

Los Angeles, Cal., Oct. 3.—Shovelers searching for the bodies in the ruins of the Times building today located seven at the foot of the elevator shaft. This makes a total of twelve bodies recovered.

**MILLIONAIRE IS KILLED** (Herald Special.)

C. Edward Gibson, Oil Man, Instantly Killed By Monlo E. Moore at Vincennes, Indiana.

Gibson, aged forty-two and a millionaire oil operator, who amassed a fortune in the Illinois oil fields, was shot and instantly killed by Monlo E. Moore, the owner of a string of Indiana theatres, at the union station here early this morning. Family troubles are said to be back of the killing. Moore was arrested at Washington, Indiana, where his wife is visiting, as he stepped from a train from Vincennes. Five shots were fired by Moore.

## TROOPS ARE ON GUARD

**TO ANSWER ARGUMENT**

Western Shippers Will File Answer to Railroads on Rate Question on October Eighteenth.

Kansas City, Mo., Oct. 3.—The members of the Western Shippers' Association committee, opposing the railroads in the rate hearing before the Interstate Commerce Commission session just closed in Chicago, are in session here today considering the evidence produced by the roads in Chicago. Arguments in rebuttal will be placed before the commission when the hearing is resumed in Washington October 18th, and this is the business of the shippers here today.

**TO PROTECT SWINTER PERMENTER, WHILE SECOND EFFORT IS BEING MADE TO GET JURY TO TRY HIM FOR MURDER.**

Louisville, Miss., Oct. 3.—State troops are guarding the court house here today as the special venire of three hundred men are being examined in a second attempt to find a jury to try Swinton Permenter, accused of the murder of Miss Janie Sharp, aged eighteen. Military protection was granted the prisoner by the governor because fifty or more men have sworn to lynch Permenter if the jury fails to convict him.

**BRODERICK APPEARS**

Before the Lorimer Investigating Committee.

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 3.—John Broderick appeared today before the Lorimer senatorial committee, accompanied by his attorney, Thomas Dawson, who will defend Broderick in Sangamon county. Broderick said he would testify only in a general way regarding the alleged bribery, but would refuse to go into detail regarding the payment of money.
