## THINKS HE WILL FIGHT COMMISSION IS ENJOINED

THE COMMANDANT AT AMALPA MOUNTS GUNS ON ARRIVAL OF U. S. GUNBOAT AND THREATENS TO OPEN FIRE.

(Herald Special.) San Salvador, Oct. 12.—The United States gunboat Princeton reached Amalpa today and demanded the surrender of Commandant St. Valladeres, who inaugurated the reign of terror against the American and British subjects located there, threatening them with imprisonment and confiscating their property.

The commandant promptly refused to surrender and sent word to the commander of the Princeton that he was not subservient to Taft's American pigs. He has mounted guns on the custom house and threatens to fire on the marines if they attempt to land.

The marines are making active preparations to take forcible possession.

## FIRST DEGREE MURDER

Is the Indictment Brought Against Dr. H. H. Crippen By the Grand Jury—May Hang.

London, Oct. 12.—The grand jury sitting in old Bailey today returned an indictment charging Dr. H. H. Crippen with murder in the first degree for the death of his wife, Belle Elmore. Miss Leneve, Crippen's companion, was indicted as an accessory in that she had guilty knowledge that the crime had been committed. Upon conviction Crippen may be hanged. Miss Leneve, under the indictment against her, escapes the death penalty.

## FURNISHING SUPPLIES

CITIZENS AND SOLDIERS ARE DISTRIBUTING SUPPLIES TO THE FIRE REFUGEES IN THE MINNESOTA COUNTRY.

(Herald Special.) International Falls, Minn., Oct. 12.—With the forest fires between International Falls and Beaudette under control, the citizens and the military companies, under command of General Wood of the Minnesota National Guard, today turned their attention to distributing supplies and attending to the suffering of the injured among the thousands of refugees of the fire zone.

The danger, however, has not entirely passed, and General Wood today called for additional troops to prevent a fresh outbreak of the fires, and also to protect the refugees from vandals who are working.

One hundred and fifty dead have been accounted for.

Fourteen Bodies Recovered. (Herald Special.) Starkville, Colo., Oct. 12.—Three more bodies were taken from the wrecked mine of the Colorado Fuel and Iron company here today, making a total of fourteen recovered.

Barnes Has Resigned. Albany, N. Y., Oct. 12.—W. J. Barnes of the Old Guard today resigned from the membership of the republican state committee. It is said that Chairman Prentiss of the committee had dropped his name from the executive committee.

Brazil Gives Recognition. Lisbon, Portugal, Oct. 11.—The announcement was made tonight that Brazil has recognized the republic of Portugal.

JUDGE KOHLSAAT OF THE FEDERAL CIRCUIT COURT RESTRAINS ILLINOIS COMMISSION FROM ENFORCING RATES.

(Herald Special.) Chicago, Oct. 12.—Judge Kohlsaat of the United States circuit court today issued a temporary injunction preventing the Illinois railroad and warehouse commission from enforcing its orders reducing express charges throughout the state.

## THE BIG STRIKE SPREADS

Believed the Employes of France's Greatest Railroad Will Join the Strikers Today.

(Herald Special.) Paris, Oct. 12.—The employes of the Eastern Railway today joined the strikers of the Northern and Western systems, who struck yesterday. The employes of the Paris, Lyons and Mediterranean, the greatest railroad in France, were in adjourned session this afternoon, and immediately after the meeting began distributing cards, reading, "Six o'clock." This is accepted as a decision by the employes to strike at 6 o'clock.

Will Join Strike. (Herald Special.) Bordeaux, France, Oct. 12.—The employes of the Central Railroad this afternoon announced they will join the general strike Thursday.

General Strike Tomorrow. The extension of the railroad employes' strike to all roads in France is predicted by tomorrow night. Such a strike will involve 38,267 engineers, 22,092 firemen and 290,713 general employes; 25,000 women employed as ticket agents and crossing tenders will also join in the strike.

## DIX SCORED ROOSEVELT

DEMOCRATIC NOMINEE FOR GOVERNOR OF NEW YORK SAYS MAN WHO ATTACKS COURTS IS A PUBLIC ENEMY.

Thompson, N. Y., Oct. 12.—"Any American who, occupying a position of authority or having the public ear, assails and attacks the courts of the country, which are now, as they have always been, seats of justice and equity, is to be regarded as a public enemy and should be so branded by all men."

This statement was made by John Alden Dix when formally notified of his nomination by the democracy of New York as its candidate for the governorship.

He attacked Roosevelt, whom he claims forced the nomination of Stimson by the Saratoga convention. Discussing the "New Nationalism," Dix characterized Roosevelt as an apostle of discord and dissension.

REV. CHARNQUIST DEAD. Well Known Author, Editor and Minister Dies Suddenly.

Taylor, Texas, Oct. 11.—Following a visit to Austin yesterday and shortly after the midnight hour this morning as he entered his home in Hutto, following a walk from the railway station, Rev. C. Charnquist, the well known author, editor and minister of the Swedish Methodist church of Taylor, Texas, dropped dead of heart failure.

Rev. Charnquist was a minister and a writer of state prominence, the author of several religious books, and was founder of the Texas Bladet, a Swedish paper of large circulation. He was 71 years of age and is survived by nine children, four boys and five girls.
