A TRAFFIC AGREEMENT SPORTS OF THE WEEK

Between Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe and Western Pacific Roads is Effective Tuesday.

(Herald Special.) San Francisco, Cal., Oct. 24.—The traffic agreement recently concluded between the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe and the Western Pacific railroads will come into operation tomorrow. The new arrangement gives the Western Pacific an outlet into southern California and territory now reached by the Santa Fe, while it will permit the latter to tap territory north of Stockton and Nevada points, now reached by the Western Pacific. One of the important results of the agreement between the two roads will be to place them in direct competition with the Southern Pacific between northern and south California and between Nevada points and El Paso, Texas.

MEMORY OF OGLETHORPE

Will Be Perpetuated By the Unveiling of a Magnificent Monument at Savannah, Ga.

(Herald Special.) Savannah, Ga., Oct. 24.—A military and naval pageant of international character is to be given in this city next month on the occasion of the unveiling of the magnificent monument erected in memory of General James Oglethorpe, the English founder of the colony of Georgia. In addition to several war vessels and regiments of troops representing the navy and army of the United States and nearly the entire National Guard of the state of Georgia the participants in the demonstration, it is expected, will include two or more ships of the British West Indian Squadron. James Bryce, the British ambassador, will be the guest of honor and one of the speakers. The complete list of speakers has not yet been announced.

Vice President Sherman is 55. (Herald Special.) Utica, N. Y., Oct. 24.—Many letters and telegrams of congratulation arrived at the home of Vice President Sherman in this city today to remind him of the fact that this is his fifty-fifth birthday anniversary.
