TEXAS HAS PLENTY OF CASH.

\$2,542,141.61 Public Money Is Held By Banks of the State.
Austin, Texas, Feb. 19.—According to reports received by the state treasury from the different depositories over the state, the amount now deposited in these depositories at the close of business yesterday amounted to exactly \$2,542,141.61. This is the maximum amount that has thus far been reached. The tax collector of Harris county deposited in the depository at Houston yesterday \$125,000 of January tax collections. As fast as the collectors get the money it is deposited in the state depositories, where it draws interest at an average rate of 3.68 per cent.

Childress, Texas, Feb. 21.—Frank L. Craig was shot and instantly killed here this morning at 8 o'clock by his fifteen-year-old son, Al Craig, following an abuse of the family by the father. Craig, it is said, commenced to quarrel with members of his family preceding breakfast and later attacked his married daughter, Mrs. Ruth Hamlin, aged eighteen. He chased her into the yard, caught her by the hair and dragging her around, threatened to cut her throat, when the son stepped from the corner of the house, calmly shouldered his shotgun and pulled the trigger, emptying the entire load into the left side of Craig's face. He fell to the ground dead. The boy, who is small for his age, weighing only sixty pounds, was placed in jail, but the sympathy of the public is with him, as it is declared he was defending the family.
