Financial Agent, A. M. Barton of state penitentiaries was here last night, on his way from Rusk to Huntsville.

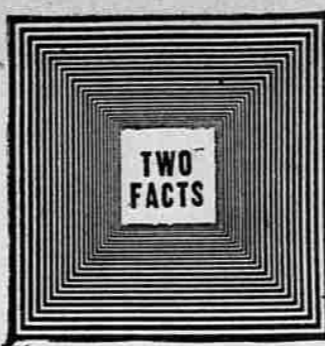
Mrs. N. A. Griffin, after a visit to Mr. and Mrs. W. V. Keller and family, left today via the morning train for her Alabama home.
