Attorneys Campbell and Sewell are in Waco, engaged in a big land suit involving Weaco city property.

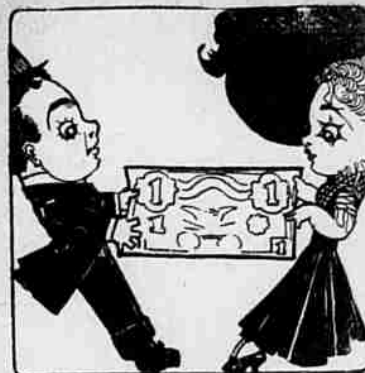
Auditor R. E. Williams of the I. & G. N., accompanied by his wife, came home from San Antonio today.

Chicago, March 14.—The case of Rev. Robert Morris Kemp, former rector of the fashionable St. Chrysostom's Episcopal church, accused of having mistreated choir boys, was called for trial in Judge Baldwin's court today. The case against the former minister has been pending for over two years, during which time strong influence has been brought to bear to delay the trial. The details of the charges created a big sensation at the time of their publication and soon after Kemp disappeared from the city. Recently he was re-

ported to be in a sanitarium near New York.

CONDITION GIVES ANXIETY.  
President Taft Returns to Washington From Pittsburg.

Washington, D. C., March 14.—President Taft arrived here this morning from Pittsburg, where he attended the funeral of Mrs. Taft's brother-in-law, who suicided Saturday. The president spent an hour with Mrs. Taft on his arrival home. Mrs. Taft is recovering slowly after her serious shock on hearing of the death of Mr. Laughlin, and her physicians are anxious about her welfare. They fear another similar attack would result seriously. President Taft has canceled his New York trip and other eastern trips, and will leave Wednesday for Chicago.

TWO GOT OFF EASY.  
Judge Dismissed Indictments Against Two of Alleged Maybray Gang.

Council Bluffs, Iowa, March 14.—Judge McPherson dismissed the indictments against E. F. Molt and Jas. R. Morrison, defendants in the Maybray swindling case, this morning.
