EGG ROLLING IS ENJOYED

Several Thousand Children Gathered on White House Grounds Today For Annual Event.

(Herald Special.)
 Washington, D. C., March 28.—In accordance with the custom originated by President Lincoln the grounds of the White House were thrown open today for the annual Easter Monday egg-rolling festival. To give the children as much room as possible for their sport and frolic, adults, unaccompanied by children were not admitted to the grounds. Several thousand children of all ages and colors availed themselves of the opportunity to roll their eggs on the lawns around the White House and play all kinds of delightful games. In the most democratic fashion the children of millionaires mingled in their joyful sport with the children of the poor and for the nonce all distinctions of wealth, station or race were wiped out. President and Mrs. Taft took great interest in the frolics of the children and frequently watched them from the windows of the White House. In the afternoon there was a band concert in the Ellipse south of the White House grounds, which attracted a large number of persons.
