Dr. Willner has with him his sister who accompanied him on his return from Cleveland, Ohio, and will remain throughout the winter.

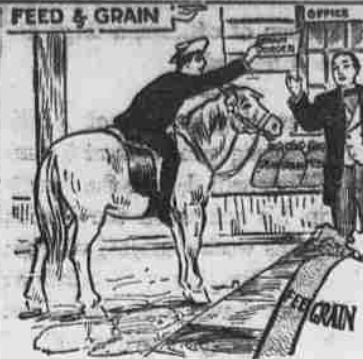
