## WATER BATTLE IS FEATURE AT CRUCES

Celebration Is One of Best in History of the Town; a Pretty Home Wedding.

Las Cruces, N. M., July 5.—With a parade by the fire department, a water battle and a number of athletic events, Las Cruces had its greatest celebration in its history Friday.

The water fight between teams of the department was an exciting feature of the celebration. After the parade in the morning the company, under chief A. P. Katerman, gave an exhibition of the force and carrying power of the fire hose. This was tried out upon several of the extra curious people to the merriment of others.

The egg race proved to be no race at all. Evidently but few had been trained for this. Of the dozen or more boys who started in the race all but one broke the egg which they were carrying in a spoon, in the first away. One boy who won, walked along serenely with no competition.

The boys' sack race was a closely contested race and was won by Tom Thorn, of Organ. Buster Red gave his first exhibition in New Mexico at Las Cruces yesterday riding the horse of A. L. Patrick after it had thrown Walters, of Organ.

The game of baseball between the Las Cruces Elks and the Las Cruces Grays was close, the Elks winning 5 to 3. In the "bronco busting" contest George Dorsey, cowboy for Walter Mossman, of Mesquite, won first money. A couple of riders got spilled.

Buero Koping, Escondido, afforded considerable amusement. The contestants were not allowed to throw the burro on the ground, but were getting their ropes on them, had to get off and "bull dog" them, throw them by hand, loosened the rope from the burro, the burro got away and was not thrown. Another man whose horse tightened up on the rope at the wrong time had a burro pulled on top of him while he was wrestling with it, but was not hurt.

In another case a man's saddle turned after he got off and that frightened the horse some and it kept going and pulling the burro which had been thrown to the ground and the man which was on top of it, but he kept on trying the burro, and finally succeeded.

The cow pony race of 150 yards and return was won by Lucero and was a thrilling event, as there were several entries. The peace of the town was marred by a brawl in the saloons. Two Mexicans and two Americans got in a fight. Deputy sheriff Moreno took the two Mexicans and one American to jail.
