REFUGEES CONTINUE TO QUIT MEXICO

San Francisco, Cal., May 16.—Steamships arriving from the coast of Mexico are bringing to this port many American and other refugees. More than 400 were passengers on the steamship San Jose, which arrived yesterday. A number of these stated that they had been compelled to travel long distances out of their way to get out of the country by way of the west coast, because of the demoralized state of the railroads.
Dr. M. T. Moore, of El Paso, Texas, who arrived with his family, told of the 16 day siege and capture of the town of Alamo, where he had been residing as a physician for two years. He said that the Americans in the district from which he had fled had been treated with every consideration both by the state troops and the federals.

Douglas, Ariz., May 20.—As a precautionary measure, to preserve the Sonora state documents of value and the money in the treasury, in case the federals succeed in taking Hermosillo, the Constitutionalists have commenced to move the principal effects of the state government to Cananea.

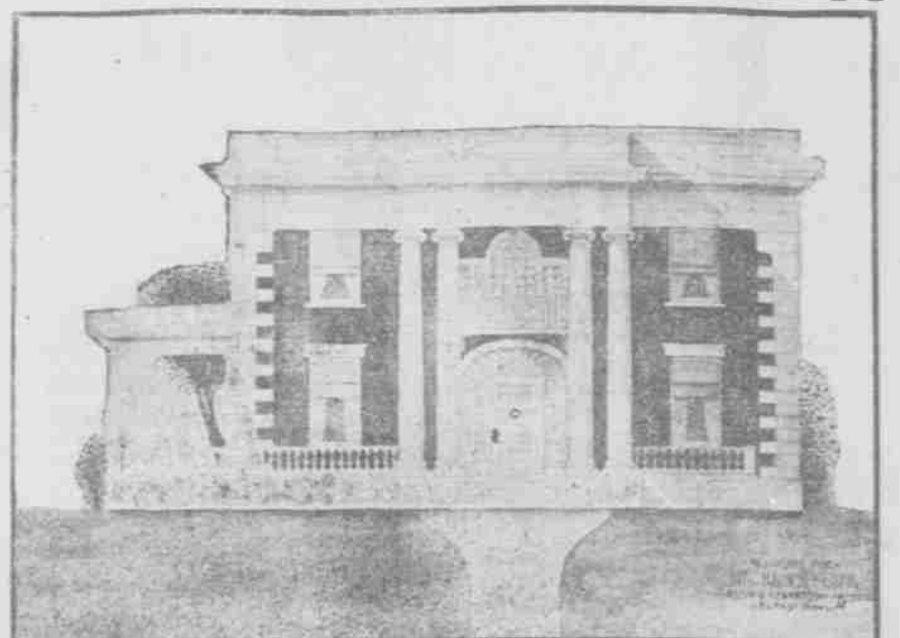

New Home For Haymon Krupp

NEW HOME FOR FLAGLER'S FORTUNE IS \$100,000,000

Burned Storage House to be Rebuilt—County to Build Warehouse.
E. Moye will build a concrete home for the Union Bank & Trust company on the Bryan Bros' site at the intersection of Texas, Oregon and San Antonio streets. He has closed a long term lease with Arthur Fullan for the corner and will replace the old three story brick building with a modern two story bank structure with a full basement. The basement will be occupied by Mr. Fullan for his store.
The first and mezzanine floors will be occupied by the Union Bank & Trust company and will be finished elaborately inside. The saloon which stands on the east end of the site will be left intact. The building will cover only that part which the Bryan Bros. store and a smaller store adjoining now occupies. The building will cost \$100,000 and will be ready to occupy at the end of a stated period. Plans are to be submitted to the contractors at a public auction to have the building completed by fall.
The El Paso storage warehouse, destroyed by fire Friday night, is to be rebuilt. Louis Hancock, of Austin, Tex., owner of the building, made this statement Tuesday morning. He has not yet decided what kind of building will be erected but it is possible that some of the present walls will be allowed to stand if they can pass inspection. Mr. Hancock arrived from Austin Monday night to investigate the damage.
A howl is kept at the fire in readiness for use if required. Monday afternoon the smoldering ruins for four hours.
New Manhattan Homes.
Fullan and Hancock have contracted with the county for the construction of five modern bungalows of five rooms each to be erected in Manhattan Heights and work will start next week. The houses will cost about \$2,500 each and will be modern in every respect.

CLAIMS GOVERNMENT APPROPRIATED SITE

Boyd Claim Relating to Elephant Butte Project to be Heard in Washington; Asks Heavy Indemnity.
Claims against the United States government centering around the selection of the Elephant Butte dam site for the government project will be heard in Washington soon by the pecuniary claims committee of the British and American governments and Dr. Nathan Boyd, representing the British claimants, left Tuesday afternoon for Washington to be present at the hearing of the claim against the government.
The Boyd claim has been hanging fire for a number of years. It originated when the government selected the Elephant Butte damsite for the location of the great government project. Dr. Boyd, an American representative, London capitalists claimed that the government appropriated the site of the Rio Grande Irrigation and Land company, the parent company, composed of the British investors and represented by Dr. Boyd. The government sued the Boyd company, alleging that the Rio Grande was a navigable stream and that the dam and project were a public work. The company was trying to obstruct it.
Dr. Boyd says. This suit, he says, was in six courts by the Rio Grande Dam and Irrigation company which was the American organization of the British company. The government, Dr. Boyd says, appropriated the site now being used for the big dam, and the claim contention followed. It was the government's contention that the dam and project were a public work. The claims committee last year in the New Mexico promoter says, and it is now due for a hearing in Washington. He will go there to get the indemnity and profits in connection to present to the claims committee. The company which he represents claims to have spent \$150,000. This is asked track in addition to compensation for the profit which might have resulted from the completion of the private project.
Dr. Boyd has written a number of pamphlets and articles attacking the government and the government engineers because of their attitude in the irrigation matter of the Rio Grande valley. He was accompanied to Washington by Mrs. Boyd. The Boyd claim says and should have an early hearing.
