## PAY YOUR POLL TAX

Have you paid your poll-tax?

There are 5,987 voters in Ellis county who have not done so; are you one of this number?

To qualify as a voter you must pay your city and state and county poll tax before 6 o'clock p. m., Saturday, January 30. The city tax is \$1.00, the state and county tax \$1.75, total \$2.75. This amount must be paid before you can vote.

Persons over 60 years old, those who have lost an eye or who are crippled can vote without a certificate of exemption. Young men who have become 21 since January 1 or who will be 21 before the next election will be entitled to a vote without being required to buy a poll tax receipt.
