been married a little less than six months when the killing took place. In his trial for murder more than one witness testified to seeing him assault his wife in the public street and severely beat and stamp her. Brozier's criminal propensity was doubtless inherent, as his father, Charley Smith, was known as a desperate character.

History of Brozier's Crime.

The crime for which Brozier Smith today paid the penalty with his life was committed about 11 o'clock on the night of February 24, 1903. Brozier and his wife lived in the servants' house at the home of Attorney Yancy D. Kemble on College street. For a few weeks prior to the murder Brozier had been cooking at a local restaurant and his wife was cooking and doing general housework for the family of Mr. Kemble.

When asked what he meant he replied that he had killed his wife, and showed blood on his hands as a verification of his statement. Leaving the saloon Brozier came up town where he was arrested by Jailor Minnick. When taken in custody by the officer Brozier had reloaded his revolver and had four extra cartridges in his pocket.

Review of the Trial.

His trial was set for April 1 and a special venire of forty men was ordered summoned from which to select the jury. On the date fixed for the trial J. T. Gill, the negro's attorney, appeared in open court and filed a motion to have the indictment quashed, alleging as a reason that the African race had been discriminated against by the jury commissioners.

There were twelve or fifteen witnesses on hand to testify for the state. Not a single witness went on the stand to testify in behalf of the accused.
