**Judgement by Agreement.**  
A judgment by agreement was rendered in the district court today in the case of J. D. Drake against the Wells-Fargo Express Company. The plaintiff was given a verdict against the express company for \$25.  
This suit instituted to recover damages in the sum of \$1995 it being alleged that the express company exercised negligence in delivering a package of anti-toxine from Dallas to Trumbull. It was alleged that the medicine was carried through Trumbull to Ennis or some other point down the line and brought back to Trumbull on another train. Because of this delay the plaintiff alleged that his two-year-old child died of diphtheria.  
The case of J. H. L. Jackson against the International and Great Northern railroad went to the jury today.  
The case of W. T. M. Dixon against R. R. Murray is now on trial.
