**"Friendly Chauffeurs" Take Diamonds, Caught, Police Cancel Licenses**  
Saturday night a guest of a local hotel informed the police of a strange adventure with two local chauffeurs. The man said the pair became friendly with him and got him "so drinking." They drove him around a while, he took a drink and then when he was "pretty well organized," dropped him at an obscure hotel, after taking the diamonds. He managed to keep his money from the men.

Later the man's wife saw the pair, and recognizing them as the two who knew her husband, asked to be driven to police headquarters to investigate a search for her missing husband. The men drove her about the city for an hour, the police say, and then left her standing on the street after telling her she was near police headquarters.

The matter reached the ears of chief of police J. B. Montgomery and a short time later the chief arrested the two drivers. However, the woman and her husband refused to file charges against the pair, owing to the fact that they would not be in El Paso to appear as witnesses. The chief forced the men to return the diamonds and canceled the chauffeurs' licenses of the two men.

**Poland Asks Red Cross to Send Physicians to Fight Raging Typhus**

Warsaw, Poland, Feb. 8.—American Red Cross officials have been asked by the Polish government to rush doctors into southeastern Galicia, where the typhus is epidemic. Since the epidemic began, it is said, 100,000 deaths have occurred here out of every five taken ill, dying.

At Larnopol there is a daily death toll of 100. Many are reported dying in the streets of Stanislaw.
