GRAHAM, TEX., Aug. 21.—Complaint was made by the revenue collector at Dallas against John Lee, G. S. Kelley and C. W. Ford, all living in Stephens county, for selling liquor at the ex-Confederate reunion at Ellaville the 30th and 31st of July. The defendants were brought before the United States commissioner at Graham the 9th inst. The trial was set for the 14th, and the commissioner wired for the papers in the case, but the Dallas authorities sent only copies to-day, and again the original complaint was written for, but nothing further was heard from Dallas and defendants preferred to enter into bond to appear before the grand jury at Graham next October, rather than make a fourth trip to Graham.
