ROMANTIC LIFE OF BRADLEY. Bradley, the murdered base ball catcher, it appears, lived a brief but romantic life. The news of his tragic death reached Louisville, where he was well known, and a paper in that city publishes the following interesting sketch of his life.

Bradley was a native of Louisville, Ky., and was well known in that city. He was a catcher on the Louisville team of the Western League in the early part of 1886. He injured his knee cap while sliding to bases at Denver, and never fully recovered from the consequent stiffness.

Bradley was unusually reticent as to his past history, and I doubt if there are many besides myself who know much of his past. An early disagreement with his father, the result of his penchant for base ball, led to an estrangement, and troubles never coming singly, he was rejected by a young lady of Oil City, Pa., to whom he was devoted.
