Honors Asked for Dionne Doctor



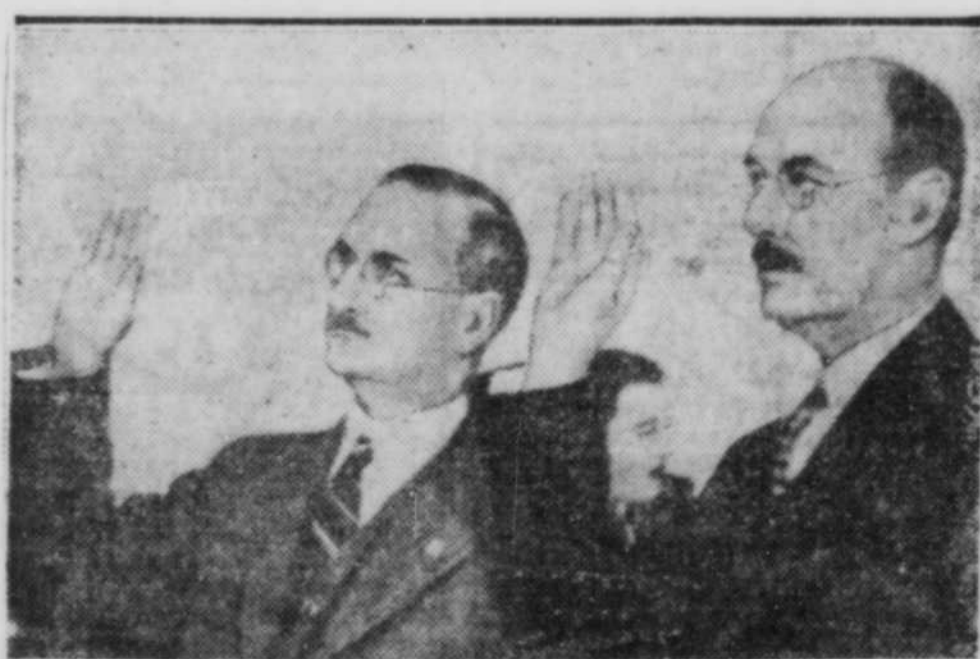

Bad News for the Bucs



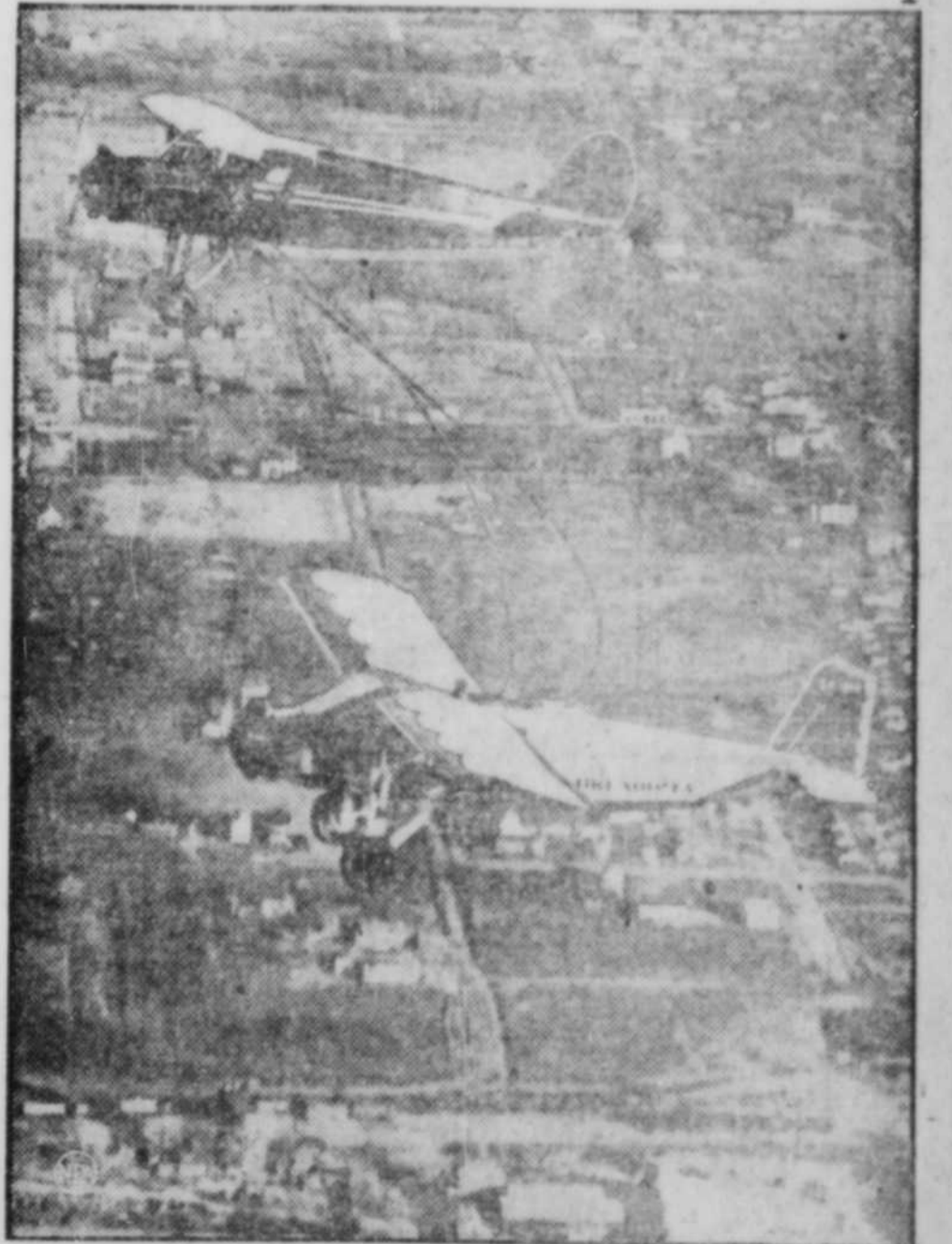
