THREE FEDERAL COURT REFORMS URGED BY TAFT

CHIEF JUSTICE HOLDS DENIAL OF JUSTICE

By Associated Press. CHICAGO, Dec. 27.—Expanding activities of the Federal Courts today swamp them, and delay is a denial of justice, Chief Justice William H. Taft of the United States supreme court, said tonight in an address before the Chicago Bar Association, urging reforms to expedite court procedure. Chief Justice Taft urged three reforms which he outlined as follows: "First, an increase in the judicial force in the trial federal courts, and an organization and effective distribution of the force by the council of judges. Second, simplicity of procedure in the trial federal courts. Third, a reduction in the obligatory jurisdiction of the circuit court and an increase in the field of discretionary jurisdiction by certiorari."

LA FOLLETTE BRINGS FARM LEADERS INTO RAILWAY RATE FIGHT

WASHINGTON, Dec. 27.—Charges were made by Senator La Follette of Wisconsin in a formal statement issued today that representatives of the railroads and of the coal, steel and lumber interests at a "secret" meeting held in Washington Dec. 9, attempted to delay their firm opposition to any and all attempts from some such body, less adherence to the agreement not to push legislation to repeal the emergency fuel guarantee system of the transportation act and to restore state control of state rates. The Wisconsin senator made his charges in elaborating on his assertion that a plan is now afoot to perpetuate the transportation act, submitted in 1917 by the majority section of which a portion expires next March 19 and to a later permanent and undesirable conditions which have made the transportation system for the past two years an instrument for the exploitation of the American people.

Howard Denies Charge

Howard, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation.

Killed in Moonshine Fight

By Associated Press. ST. LOUIS, Dec. 27.—Police tonight claimed that Joseph O'Neil, age 21, known as "Finn O'Neil" and Everett E. Summers, age 21, a Toledo, Ohio, police hunter, were killed in a battle with a gang of moonshiners in Eureka city 7:35 a. m. when they attempted to raid a still very early today. The bodies, it was claimed by a chief of Detectives James W. Heaslip, may have been a victim of their deaths.

Prison Telegrapher Dead

Lewis, 36, general clerk of the St. Louis and San Francisco was found dead in the back of a railroad telegraph office here this afternoon following an attack of pneumonia. He was said to be the oldest general telegrapher in the United States.
