COMMISSIONERS ASKED TO HELP ON TRAIL WORK

CANADIAN, Aug. 9.—The Commissioners of the counties in the Panhandle traversed by the Southwest Trail will consider an urgent appeal from the secretary of the Canadian-Clovis division of the Southwest Trail regarding the reorganization and systematic grading of the trail through the Panhandle of Texas when they meet in regular monthly session next Monday according to a state made today by the secretary of the Canadian-Clovis division. In the letter sent to the various Commissioners' Courts it was pointed out that the Southwest Trail is now plainly marked from Kansas City to Ell Paso and the prediction is made that with the present upkeep of the Southwest Trail it will soon become one of the greatest lines of automobile traffic between the populated centers of the north and east and California and the great southwest.

The Commissioners' Court of Hamilton County has been repairing the floor of the bridge over the Canadian River at Canadian for several weeks past. All of the highways centering in Canadian are in splendid condition. Ochsiree county has a force of graders at work on the D. C. D. Highway and the grading of the entire mileage of the Highway through Ochsiree County will be pushed.

SUDAN HAS RAIN

SUDAN, Texas, Aug. 9.—Half an inch rain fell in the Sudan country last night, thus bringing the rainfall to twenty-eight inches since the middle of last April. In the growing period of 1922 this section received forty inches of rain. In 1921 1919 two inches and in 1918 two inches. Such assurance naturally assures bumper crops and the Sudan country has made a big crop record ever since settlement commenced four years ago.

### To Build New Gin

SUDAN, Texas, Aug. 9.—The Sudan Gin Company, composed of local farmers, has just received all its machinery for the installation of a four-stand, 70-saw huller gin. The plant, when completed, will be the latest in ginning equipment, comprising the standard system which eliminates all brush and the improved Munnell-hull beaker and cleaner. The power plant is composed of an 80-horsepower triplex Anderson oil engine which displaces the old style steam engine and boiler. The house will be all steel covered and floors and foundations of concrete. The cost of the plant will be near \$20,000.
