History's Note—The following editorial was taken from the Wichita Beacon of Wednesday, November 22, in regard to the fighting qualities of Dr. David T. Harrison, Amarillo physician who lost his life in the world war.

One of the most eminent athletes that has ever lived a man was engraved on the foundation of David Thomas Harrison of the class of '06 Northwestern University.

He served four years on the scrubs—he never quit.

This is the epitaph. As if to round out the appreciation of the life of a man of which the world knows, it is recorded that Harrison lost his life in France while carrying a comrade to safety.
