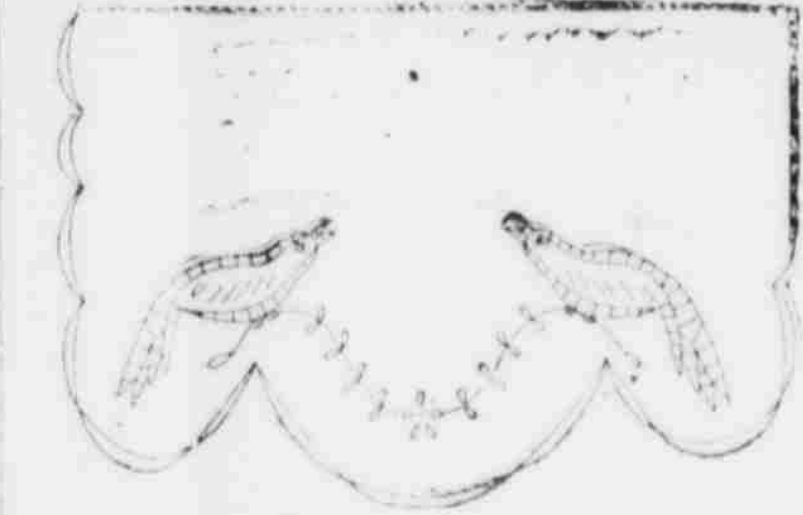
IT'S GRANDMOTHER'S RECIPE TO BRING BACK COLOR AND LUSTER TO HAIR
