Morale Of Army Officers Lowers; Men Say Government Meets Increase In H. C. Of L. By Reducing Their Rank

THE high cost of living, low salaries for army officers, and in some instances a feeling that there has been a lack of gratitude shown in demotions, are combining to lower the morale of the commissioned personnel of the United States army, according to army officers in this district, who are agreeing with a memorandum recently issued by Maj. Gen. William Hays, chief of the war plans division of the general staff, copies of which have reached El Paso.

Morale, so impressed has Gen. Patton C. March, chief of staff, become with the statements made in the memorandum and with constantly lowering morale of army officers that he has ordered an investigation made in every division. The probe is being made in El Paso.

One of the effects of small pay and demotions is that many officers are resigning as rapidly as possible. Between the signing of the armistice, November 11, 1918, and August 12, 1919, the number of officers who have resigned is 1365. On October 21, 1918, there were 18,462 officers in the regular army. It thus appears that 10 percent, or practically one officer in eight, has had his resignation accepted in the past nine months.

The unpleasant fact pointed to by the conditions, army officers say, is that after every man has resigned who intends to do so, only two kinds of officers will remain. These kinds are the officers who have been with the service years and are trained in no other line or the kind of officers well. Ballentine has the drilling contract.

RANGER WELLS SHOW DECLINE EASTLAND POOL

Figures on Decrease Are Not Without Encouraging Features, However.

According to statements and figures published in recent oil journals, wells in the Ranger, Tex., field is 14 percent per month. This calculation is based, it is claimed, upon an average decline of all wells in the field from the time of completion to the present time. The Ranger field proper is considered in the estimate.

There is further encouragement, however, in the fact that many of the wells in the field are showing a decline from the first pay, or even from the time above the so-called Gordon sand. The time wells have shown the best tenacity of any producers from the lower strata, possibly due to the fact that so few are producing from the time in comparison to the total number of wells in the field, and this means that the average decline is not so high as at present. Wells that are showing their oil from the upper stratum at the Bend series have the prospect of getting renewed life from deeper drilling, and even those from the lower depth in the Bend may be further revived by string treatment of nitro-stilvestin, or putting them on the pump after their flow has stopped.
