

TEXAS LEGISLATURE TO GET IMPORTANT BILLS GOVERNING FARMS, TAXATION AND JAPS

ASTIN, Tex., Jan. 4.—When the thirty seventh legislature of Texas convenes in biennial session, January 13, indications point to one of the most important sessions in many years. The lawmakers will get only one chance to deal with a multiplicity of bills and resolutions, but also with problems incident to the reconstruction period. The expected lawmakers are making their plans to remain at Austin for not less than 100 days, and a special session is probable.

The first bill in the house will be over the election of a speaker. There are three candidates for this important post. Charles C. Thomas of Denton, A. B. Curtis of Tarrant and Fred W. Horton, of Dallas, all of whom were members of the thirty sixth legislature. Representative Curtis was a leader on the floor and a popular member from Dallas.

In the senate, Gov. Lynch Davidson of Houston will preside and a resolution proposing to elect him as speaker will be introduced. Probably one of the most important measures which will be introduced at least from a political point of view, will be the bill of reorganization.

PLOT OF NAVAL OFFICER AND EX-NEWSPAPERMAN TO SEIZE SAMOA FOILED BY NAVY PROBE

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., Jan. 4.—American Samoa's defense-inspecting chief of police is out of jail and the judge who had seven other jobs in a single holding court, according to a dispatch from Honolulu, Hawaii, which reached here today. This change marks a normal follow-up of a naval inquiry which resulted in discharging an attempt by a naval officer and a former newspaper reporter to control the naval administration of the American possession in the South Pacific.

In furtherance of this attempt the naval officer, Grover H. Boucher, lieutenant commander, and the ex-reporter, Arthur A. Greene, solicited the support of commander A. C. Kail, second in rank to commander Warren T. Terhune, governor of the island. The three piled charges against Terhune and his administration, and finally Kail tried to send a wireless message to the navy department at Washington landing his superior as he went.

Terhune Committed Suicide.
With the message in front of him, Terhune, suffering from ill health, committed suicide. The pitiful part of this tragedy developed when the court in Honolulu, Hawaii, which had arrested Terhune's administration of all charges, including the murder of a police officer, the court martial of Boucher and the removal of Kail from his post.

If the parasite can be located, it will be introduced in the territory to combat fruit flies.

Ancient Note Held Good By Jap District Court
Tokyo, Japan, Jan. 4.—Found in an iron box in the estate of a late bank director in 1889 for ¥ 100,000 and purchased by Yasutaro Maruyama, a medicine manufacturer at Daitoku, Osaka, was held good by the Yokohama district court. The bank has been directed to pay Mr. Maruyama the face value with accrued interest.

JAP SOCIALIST ARRESTED FOR SELLING HIS BOOK
Tokyo, Japan, Jan. 4.—Kazuo Kato, a well-known Tokyo socialist, has been arrested in connection with illicit sale of his book called "From Communism to Socialism" which had been prohibited by the police. Members of the socialist union, including several prominent leaders, were arrested for selling forbidden literature in the streets.

THOMAS GILRUTH, JURIST, DEAD AT ALBUQUERQUE
Albuquerque, N. M., Jan. 4.—Thomas W. Gilruth, 77, former member of the Colorado supreme court, died here. He is survived by his wife and two daughters, Mrs. John T. Gilroy, of Seattle, Wash., and Mrs. Clarence H. Stone, of Denver. The body will be shipped to Denver, where it is understood, burial will be made.

GERMANS BADLY RECEIVED
Berlin, Germany, Jan. 4.—German newspapers publish a story from Prague saying a French general charged with the task of leading the "Die Waechter" army. He is said to have thought it was the Czechoslovakian national army.

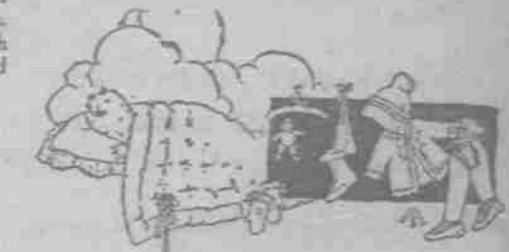
