

WHEAT GOT SUDDENLY EXCITED

BEHIND THE LAST FIFTEEN MINUTES OF CHANGE

AND ADVANCED NEARLY A CENT. CORN WAS WEAK, BUT WHEAT PULLED IT UP A FRACTION—THE VISIONS CLOSED PROVER-COTTON FIRM.

CHICAGO, April 17.

The wheat market got suddenly excited during the last fifteen minutes of change on the cash business which developed here and at New York. May sold 1 1/4-1/8 against 1 1/2 last night. The following were given as reasons for the spurt: Sales of 200,000 here for shipment East at the equivalent to the May price; sales of a round number of car loads from 25 to 100 in addition to above to go to a Michigan miller and other small lots for country millers, and sales reported from New York 31 boat loads, including 12 at out ports, with cash selling to millers at 1-1/8 over May. The big feature of the situation was the claims that outside Chicago there is practically no available wheat for export. There was no influence in the cables. Routine news was somewhat bullish. North-west receipts were 194, compared with 202 last year, against 272,000 last year. Michigan millers at five different points bought wheat in this market. Indiana packages said many millers in that State will depend upon Chicago wheat from now until harvest. Minneapolis and Toledo dispatches were bullish in tone.

Corn was weak during the greater part of the day, but closed about 1-1/8 higher than the figures of the day previous. Speculative interest was all transferred to the wheat market. There was a big business doing in oats and rye. The market closed 1/4-1/8 lower than yesterday. Liberal selling caused the decline, although buying was urgent and at times general. The trading in provisions was light, and fluctuating. Pork advanced 1/8 to 1-1/8 for the day. Lard is 1/2 lower; ribs unchanged. The receipts for tomorrow are estimated: Wheat 29 cars, corn 120 cars, oats 155 cars, hoag 18,000 head.

Chicago, Ill., April 17.—There was very little activity in the wheat pit today until the last half hour, when the market turned very strong and advanced 1 cent per bushel from low point on good inquiry for cash wheat. A few cars at a premium were reported. The cash demand for our local market has also been very good. Full price, with transactions in the most active business. Lighter and quiet. Clearness for the day nearly as bullish as usual.

Receipts at primary points appear to be on the decrease, notwithstanding the fact that they are only about one-half of what they were a year ago. LIVERPOOL RESPONDED TO A STRONG NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, April 17.

The cotton market opened at an advance of 3 to 5 points and closed steady at 10 to 15 points advance. Total sales, 28,000 bales. The conduct of the market was erratic and excited from start to finish. The advance from Liverpool a holiday in that market since Thursday last showed a full response to the net advance which had taken place in the New York market during the holiday. The trade hardly expected this. Soon after the opening a flood of selling orders struck the market and caused a break to about last night's figures, after which it was anybody's market until the afternoon, when buying orders poured in from all directions. The favorable feature apart from the Liverpool rise was the report of a definite settlement of the Japan-China war. Large buying orders from New Orleans today. A few quiet contracts led every upward movement and trading in that month was enormous. The liquidation of long cotton was very heavy. Spot cotton advanced 1/4-1/8, with middling upland quoted at 5 1/8.

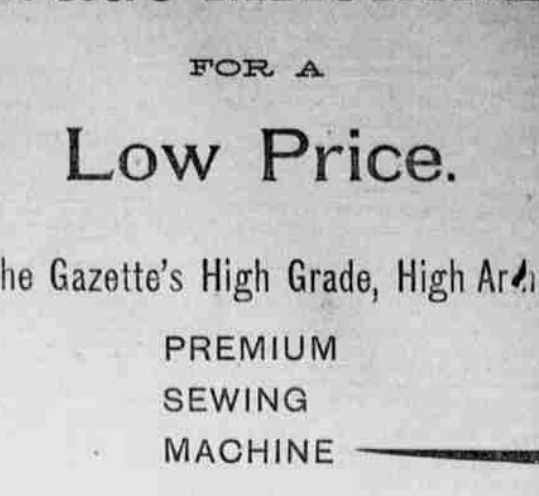
