STONED American Consulate at Valencia SPANISH SPIES BREAK OUT A NEW WITH THE BROTHERS ACTION OF MOB. WINDOWS SMASHED AND OTHER EXHIBITIONS OF HOSTILITY ARE MADE. The Authorities Are Obligated to Close Several Colleges to Prevent Students Congregating.

Valencia, March 5.—The disorders which were prevalent here when the news was first received of the action of the United States senate on the Cuban question broke out afresh today and there were renewed demonstrations of hostility to the United States. The mob made its way to the United States consulate which was stoned and the windows of which were smashed by the infuriated people.

BEHEADED IN COREA EIGHT JAPANESE CABINET MEMBERS MURDERED. Their Heads to Be Exposed on Poles and Their Corpses Dragged Through the Streets. San Francisco, Cal., March 5.—The steamer China arrived today from Yokohama bringing news of another Japanese cabinet member murdered in Corea. On February 10 a detachment of Russian marines, numbering 127, arrived here and the seven cabinet members known as prominent Japanese statesmen, were beheaded and their corpses dragged around the streets.

DATE WILL STAND GENERAL GORDON SAYS HE WILL NOT CHANGE IT. United Confederate Veterans Will Meet at Richmond as Called at the Houston Reunions. Washington, March 5.—The decision published by General Walker, commander of the G. A. R., in reference to the proposed joint parade in New York on July was called to the attention of Senator Gordon of Georgia, who has been commander-in-chief of the United Confederate Veterans ever since their organization and he was asked if he proposed to take any action looking to a change of the date of the next annual meeting of the organization at Richmond, June 20 and July 1 and 2.

HELPLESS Wander the People Over the Earth WHERE THE TORCH HAS SPREAD DESOLATION IN THE CUBAN ISLAND. REDUCED TO ASHES SEVERAL IMPORTANT VILLAGES WIPED FROM THE MAP. Many Engagements Are Fought, in Which Soldiers on Both Sides are Slain—Weyler Indorsed.

Havana, March 5.—Captain General Weyler visited the military hospitals today and expressed himself as being satisfied with the manner in which the wounded and sick were being cared for and with the condition of the hospitals. Up to date the insurgents have burned thirteen villages and towns in the province of Pinar del Rio. A detachment of insurgents belonging to Garcia's forces has captured the fort at Santa Cruz, this province, the smallest place north of Cabaiguana, by surprise. The insurgents called upon the garrison to surrender and the sergeant in charge led the fort for the purpose of conferring with the insurgent leader. In the meanwhile the insurgents surrounded the fort entered it and made prisoners of the volunteers who were also capturing all their arms and the supply of ammunition. The volunteers were subsequently released and the detachment of troops in pursuit of the insurgents.

REPUBLICAN SPLIT. FLORIDA STATE CONVENTION IN A TUMMOL. One Faction Perfects the Organization and Elects an Uninstructed Delegation of McKelveyites. Tallahassee, Fla., March 5.—The Republican state convention split at 4:15 this morning when the Gibby faction, representing seventy-five out of a total of 229 votes, bolted the hall, claiming they were unable to secure fair treatment under the organization effected last night.
