THE RENEGADE APACHES Being Holly Pursued by Troops - A Trail Struck.

DEMING, N. M., Oct. 25. - A courier from Carlisle Springs, situated near the International line brings the news that the band of Apache renegades who murdered two ranchmen near Morenci in Sonora last Friday, and who are the authors of more than a score of killings in Old Mexico within the past few months, crossed the line into Old Mexico last evening. The party was composed of twelve warriors and one squaw. A detail of United States troops, numbering fifty men, under command of Lieutenant Swan, of Fort Bowie, is giving hot pursuit and was only fifteen miles behind the savages yesterday. A large number of armed men are trailing the savages in the vicinity of Coloni, Apache county, where they murdered the Thompson family, but so rapid have been their movements that they have been unable to keep track of their whereabouts. The band is led by the celebrated "Kid," and all indications point to their annihilation.

HALF ROASTED. A Whole Family Perishes in a Cleveland, O., Fire.

CLEVELAND, O., Oct. 27. - Fire most appalling in result, occurred about 1:30 o'clock this morning in a ten-story frame building at the corner of Central avenue and Harriet street, near the Cleveland and Pittsburg railway crossing, an entire family named Vacha, consisting of father, mother and two little boys, perishing. They were all probably overcome by smoke. Their bodies were recovered after the fire was extinguished in a half roasted condition. The cause of the fire is unknown, but it is believed to have originated in a saloon on the ground floor.

Fire at Roman. TEXARKANA, ARK., Oct. 27. - [Special.] - Last night at the little town of Roman ten miles north of here the residence and storehouse, together with contents belonging to William Freed were destroyed by fire. Loss, \$9000; insurance, \$4900. A clerk employed by Freed had, while deputy sheriff, a short time ago killed a negro who resisted arrest and it is thought the fire was kindled by negroes to avenge their dead comrade.

Cholera Scare in New Jersey. JERSEY CITY, N. J., Oct. 27. - There was great excitement on Jersey Heights this morning. William Bonney, a carpenter, was taken sick yesterday at noon and died at 1 o'clock this morning with all the symptoms of cholera. The attending physician and city physician who saw the man in a short time pronounced it a case of genuine Asiatic cholera. The county physician thought it was cholera-morbus. An analysis is being made.

Storms Off England. LONDON, Oct. 27. - Heavy gales swept over the Channel yesterday and during the night. The storm was particularly severe on the southeast coast of Ireland. The schooner Resolute, while attempting to enter the harbor, was driven ashore. Her crew were rescued. The schooner Annie, of Liverpool, County Down, Ireland. No assistance could reach her, and her crew of six were drowned.
