THE WARSHIP TEXAS.

The success of the Texas on her first sea-going trial is a cause of congratulation for more reasons than one. We should under any circumstances feel gratified that this battle ship has shown herself to be well planned and well built, swift in motion, easy to handle, and in every way a valuable addition to our naval defenses. All this the Texas undoubtedly is.

Another cause for satisfaction is that her success will dispose of the unpleasant and partisan feeling evoked by her recent slight mishap in the Brooklyn dry dock. At the first intimation that there might be some structural defect in the vessel, the organs of blind party rancor and jealousy attempted to make capital out of the event. The Texas was one of the battleships provided for by the first Cleveland administration. Her designs were selected by competition among English naval con-

APPEARS WARLIKE

CONCENSUS OF OPINION AT WASHINGTON PRESAGES TROUBLE.

BIG SLUMP IN STOCKS.

London Spurns Our Securities and Wall Street Goes from Panicky to Wild.

CONTINENTAL EUROPE

SIDES WITH ENGLAND, AND LOOKS AMERICA AGAINST THE WORLD.

"War news" took a different turn to-day. Feeling has been strong since the President's message was first launched, that there would be no conflict between England and America, but developments across the water, and especially in Continental Europe, are causing the heavens of peace to begin losing with clouds of war.

France has interests in South America, similar to those of England; Spain is likewise situated, while Germany has reasons for looking askance at the Monroe doctrine. Out of all the expressions by representatives of European nations, but one has so far failed to condemn President Cleveland's attitude, and that one—America's old friend, Russia, is non-committal. Even the Mexican dictator, right at our doors, takes occasion to say that he will say nothing. Chili champions England.

But excepting Mexico and Chili, all the independent governments of both Americas are ablaze with enthusiasm for the American cause, and are casting up their resources, in anticipation of measuring arms with the half of Europe, or with all, if she please.

Backed up by the cabinets of Europe, it is now thought hardly reasonable that England will recede an iota from her position. On the other hand, this nation seems a unit in support of her president and congress, and that is the situation to-day.

Meanwhile, the calamities of war have already befallen the bourses of England and America. Wall street echoed the war rumors yesterday in thunders that blasted fortunes in a moment. "Millions were lost in an hour, the selling orders were enormous, and amid the wildest scenes they ripped the market to pieces. Five firms went under. It was a panic galore. London got the fright, too, and they bounced our securities out of their market and won't touch them any more than they would a live wire."

Yet underlying all is a sentiment that all will be well. England will recede, say Americans—Cleveland is talking for political effect, think the English. The issue is trifling, all admit, to involve such a mighty conflict. Yet it is well to remember that a great principle is involved, and fierce wars have waged for smaller cause; while seldom in history have wars, the most gigantic, been anticipated by those who, minimizing the consequences all the while, have nevertheless gone on unloosing the dogs of war.

If some Peter the Hermit would stir up the Christian nations of the world to send armies with light in them to the relief of the Armenians, we would have crusades with some sense in them. A war of extermination on the Turks would be a good way to serve the Lord at present.
