### CROWDS ARRIVING IN WASHINGTON.

Arrangements Nearing Completion For Taft's Inauguration—City Will be a Blaze of Glory.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 26.—Thousands of people from almost every state in the union are already invading Washington, and, unless all signs fail, the attendance of the visitors at the inauguration of President Taft will be unprecedented in the nation's history. The advance guard of the great tide of humanity that will fill the national capital to overflowing and tax its hospitality and accommodations to the utmost is now on the ground, and is making itself very much at home. Pennsylvania avenue and other leading thoroughfares are comfortably filled with a bustling, eager, good natured throng, while the Capitol and the Department buildings are receiving their full quota of visiting sightseers. Railroad officials are fully prepared to handle the greater crowds that are expected to arrive with each succeeding day, and the members of the inaugural committee are especially gratified that the invasion has begun at so early a date.

**"Fakir" Brigade on Hand.**  
Among the first visitors to reach the city were the street "fakirs," who never fail to reap a rich harvest on such occasions. The first of these gentry arrived in Washington this morning and lost no time in beginning operations. The principal article to be sold during the coming week by these curbstone merchants are badges, inaugural souvenirs, pictures of Taft and Sherman, "Billy Possums," and other appropriate and saleable novelties. The New York contingent of the "fakir" brigade, a well organized body of glib-tongued hawkers backed by ample capital, is expected to descend on the capital the first of the week, and its advent will mark the beginning of a vigorous campaign for the separation of visitors from their nickels, dimes and quarters.

A less picturesque and far less desirable element of visitors has also put in an appearance. These are the pickpocket, sneak thieves, confidence men and other crooks who never fail to gather in the crowd. Elaborate police arrangements for handling these undesirable citizens have been perfected. Every available officer and private of the force will be on duty throughout the week and 500 special policemen have been employed. In addition detectives to a considerable number have been brought here from outside cities to aid in the maintenance of order.

**Decorations are Elaborate.**  
The city is already beginning to wear gay holiday attire, and the principal thoroughfares are bright and cheerful with a liberal display of flags bunting and other forms of decoration. By Tuesday the elaborate scheme of decoration contemplated by the committee, it is expected, will be carried out in detail, making Washington a city literally ablaze with national colors.

The decorative scheme centers in the court of honor which is the street space on Pennsylvania avenue between 15th and 17 street northwest. This space has been set with Venetian masts, thirty feet apart and twenty-five feet high. On the top of each mast is to be a basket filled with evergreens and artificial flowers. From each will depend streamers of red and white, upon which will be the initial letters T and S in blue on a white background.

At Jackson Place and Madison Place have been erected large pylons, four at each intersection. These are massive Doric columns on pedestals, ornamented with greens and architectural emblems. Lines of electric bulbs are strung between the pylons and also between the Venetian masts, giving a brilliant illumination of the whole court of honor.

**Program for the Day.**  
The program of the inaugural period is divided into five important features and some others of lesser degree of interest.  
First—The imposing military division of the pageant, which is being arranged by Major General J. Franklin Bell, who has been appointed grand marshal.

Second—The civic organization division of the parade.  
Third—The great display of fireworks on the White Lot, just in front of the White House, in combination with the illumination of the streets of Washington, the dome of the United States Capitol and the Washington monument.

Fourth—The inaugural ball in the Pension building.  
Fifth—The forenoon parade of American veteran soldiers and sailors of the G. A. R., United Spanish War Veterans and the Army and Navy Union, which will form the escort of honor to President-elect Taft and Vice President-elect Sherman to the Capitol, where they will take the oath of office, preceding the great parade and other features.
