## SOUTH TEXAS GARDENERS

Will Meet at Brownsville August 16 and 17.

**E. C. Green, Secretary of the Gardeners' Association, Receives Assurances of Special Rates on Railroad for the Convention.**

In accordance with the plan for holding the proposed convention of the South Texas Gardeners' Association at Brownsville, Mr. E. C. Green, in charge of the South Texas Garden, who is secretary of the association, wrote to General Passenger Agent Wm. Doherty of the St. L., B. and M. railroad asking if the company would make a special rate for those wishing to attend the meeting. In reply, Mr. Green has received a letter from Mr. Doherty, in which he notifies him that the road will be pleased to comply with the request, making the following rates for the convention, being good from the point of sale of tickets to Brownsville and return:

Harlingen 75 cts., Mercedes \$1.00, McAllen \$1.25, Sam Fordyce \$1.50, Lyford \$1.00, Raymondville \$1.00, Sarita \$1.15, Kingsville \$2.40, Robstown \$2.85, Angelita \$3.00, Corpus Christi \$3.20.

Tickets will be on sale Thursday, the 15th inst., being limited for return as late as Sunday, the 18th.

Mr. Doherty expresses cordial wishes for a large crowd and a successful meeting.

This will be the first meeting of the South Texas Gardeners at Brownsville, and it is hoped that it may be a success in every way.
