Opens Monday Afternoon at 3:30

About fifty or seventy-five home-seekers are expected to arrive in Brownsville tonight and a great many more will arrive Saturday and Sunday nights.

Arrangements are being made to have a picnic for the Mexican protestant Sunday schools of Matamoros and Brownsville. The picnic grounds are located on the resaca near Olmito.

A new and excellent program at the Electric Theatre will be shown tonight. Comic colored pictures which comprise the following subjects: "Maniac Juggler," "Marvelous Powder," "The Day of 61," and "Mysterious Glasses." 4-10-2.

The new skating rink and amusement hall on Washington street has been finally completed and turned over to the proprietors, Messrs. J. Celaya, jr., and J. C. Wreford. The new building is 110 feet long by 50 feet wide, being quite ample for a skating rink, as well as for an electric theater, for both of which purposes it will be used. The hall is well ventilated and every provision made for the comfort of patrons. The rink will be opened next Monday night. The managers will provide music for the opening and will make it a gala occasion.

Lights in great abundance are wanted for the illumination of the concert grounds in Carson Park tomorrow night. As this concert is a complimentary affair, and admission will be entirely free to all, it would be well for the citizens who can do so to lend a helping hand in making such arrangements as are needed for the comfort of the audience. Any who can lend lanterns will confer a great favor by sending them, or else notifying Mr. Perdomo at the immigration office, who will send for them.

It was found impossible to get the work of repairing, painting, etc., finished in time, and so, much to the regret of Mr. McClintock as well as others, it was impossible to have the opening today. It is to be hoped that our citizens will aid as far as they can in accommodating such of the home-seekers as may come here on the excursion, which is now due. There are restaurants in plenty to provide for a very large number of guests and if rooms are provided for the visitors by those who have rooms to spare, it will tide the town over a very disagreeable and deplorable plight, and help to give visitors a better impression of the town than they may receive otherwise.
