Their journey also included a visit to the Lewis & Clark exposition at Portland, Oregon, which they found both instructive and entertaining. Mr. and Mrs. Blalack are expected home in the next three or four days.

For some time it has been known that Fort Brown is below the average in the matter of quarters both for officers and enlisted men, and recommendations have been made for improvements at this post. But it takes more than mere recommendations to secure the needed improvements. If our citizens are interested in the matter, and they should be, it would be a wise plan to solicit the good offices of our congressman, Hon. John N. Garner, and request him to place the matter before congress. Mr. Garner has already signified his willingness to do everything in his power for the benefit of his constituents, and will no doubt take pleasure in bringing the matter to the attention of congress. Other posts have been improved, but it was not by sitting down and waiting for congress to voluntarily make the appropriation necessary. If we want these improvements at Fort Brown, and THE HERALD has been informed they are badly needed, the quicker the matter is taken up, the quicker it will be settled. This is the second most important post in the state, and is should be looked after. Let our more prominent citizens take the matter in hand, and they may feel assured of all the assistance possible from army officers here, and see if we can not secure the necessary improvements for Fort Brown. It is estimated that \$100,000 would put this post in first class condition, with modern quarters for officers and enlisted men, and the greater part of this amount would be expended in Brownsville.

Reports so far as obtainable indicate that the rain this morning was general throughout this section. About three fourths of an inch fell at Olmito, and about the same amount fell here. It is reported that there was a three inch rainfall at Kingsville, with indications that it was general in that section. On account of the telegraph line up the river being down, no reports can be obtained from that region. Moisture was badly needed in the entire section, and the precipitation last night is very acceptable.
