Oil Field News.

Latest Developments and Items of Interest
Relevant to the Petroleum Industry.

Oil Shipments.
The following is the report for yester-
day, covering shipments since last
reported, there being a lapse of one
day:

Cars by rail, 410; barrels, 69,763.
Cars by water, 252; barrels, 42,000.
Previous day, cars, 294, barrels, 49,
452.
Total for the month, cars, 5568;
barrels, 935,811.

All conversant with the subject seem
inclined to dispute the certainty of
vast profits to the manufacturers fol-
lowing the introduction of Beaumont
oil in unlimited quantities. The acces-
sibility and abundance of Beaumont oil
have no tendency to any wastefulness
in handling and transportation. The
quickest and shortest routes for trans-
portation are the subject of deep con-
sideration at present to those interest-
ed in the oil enterprise. In this con-
nection it is understood that there is
no doubt that a company will be operat-
ing shortly a barge line over the route
shown in the Times-Democrat recently.
The essential advantage of this route
is that it lessens the distance from Sab-
ine Pass to New Orleans by 110 miles.
This great saving is of the more im-
portance from the fact that it includes
besides the actual gain in distance the
elimination of the river current for
eighty miles of the river's length, the
result of entering the river at a point
thirty-five miles from New Orleans
through a series of canals connecting
that point with Grand Pass at the
entrance of Barataria Bay. So the dis-
tance saved in actual miles on the
round trip is figured at 220 and the
saving in elimination of current is esti-
mated at about 30 miles. This total of
some 260 miles is regarded as one
of the most substantial commercial ad-
vantages ever possible for New Or-
leans.

The route of the proposed waterways
in detail is as follows: Grand
Pass across Barataria bay through Bay-
ou Landry, and then through several
small canals and cutoffs (to be dredged
ed.) running through very soft prairie
marsh. Then Lake Laurie connects
these cutoffs with Myrtle Grove Bayou;
there may be some delay in securing
water front property near Myrtle Grove
plantation, as there will be the neces-
sity of holding the property in fee
simple.

To secure sufficient depth throughout
the length of these waterways consid-
erable dredging will be necessary, but
depths of ten feet or more are found
in many parts of the route, and the
lower of these figures is ample for
light-draft barges, as the cost of trans-
ferring barrels from one barge to
another is small. At one-half a cent a
barrel the heavier barges could be
brought to Grand Pass and transfer
made to the light-draft barges, allowing
the seagoing barges to return at once
for further cargoes.

The possibility of direct north and
south waterways between the Gulf and
New Orleans are immense, particularly
when it is taken into consideration
that in the future the route might be
so deepened as to admit of the use of
the route by vessels of heavy draft.
Aside from the commercial advantages
of the proposed waterways, a direct
communication would be effected with
the surf-washed islands of the Gulf
coast, notably Grand Island and Grand
Tert Island.

Dredges have been brought to the
sites of the canals and the work of im-
proving the channels will go on steadily
and the owners of Beaumont gushers in-
terested in the enterprise hope soon
to have the opportunity of shipping
their oil by the new route.—Times
Democrat.

Below is given the last report of the
United States government official on
the amount of oil in tanks in this field.
The blank lines are where the tankage
stands, but was empty at the time.
The report cannot be regarded as show-
ing the average amount of oil stored
for the reason that on June 1 the date
of the storage, the demand had been
abnormal on account of the big supply
of empty cars on hand right at the
time and the consequent demeritment
of oil in the tanks. The amount of oil
actually stored in earthen and wooden
reservoirs belonging to individuals is
not included in this report either and
the total amount of oil above ground
today according to the Enterprise sta-
tistics runs above 3,000,000 as was
reported in the last resume of the
month's business. But the showing of
the government is a good one and com-
pares favorably with that of any other
source favorably with that of any other

report is about 3,000,000 barrels short
on general conditions. When such large
reservoirs of the size of the German-
American Oil Co and the Lockwood
tanks the Babbitt syndicate and others
are still not mentioned, are omitted,
and the oil men familiar with the situa-
tion can discern in an instant where
this 3,000,000 barrels will be made up.
The report is given as the figures of the
government and not as those of the
Enterprise and the errors therein are
too numerous to mention specifically.

Dr. D. S. Speer, a prominent physi-
cian and land owner of Jefferson
county, spent Saturday and Sunday
in Houston and while here closed a
deal for one of the largest tracts of
land ever sold in Jefferson county.
The tract consists of 100,000 acres of
choice rice land and is situated in
the immediate vicinity of Beaumont.
The doctor was not ready to fur-
nish the names of the purchasers or

The tract will be immediately
opened up for colonization and the
immediate future will see just that
much more land devoted to rice cul-
ture. G. H. Works, secretary to the
manager of the Heywood Oil com-
pany, was a visitor to Houston yester-
day and talked entertainingly and
enthusiastically about the Queen of
the Neches.

"Beaumont," said Mr. Works, "is
just beginning to expand. We will
have street cars running in two
weeks and our magnificent sewer
system will shortly be completed.
Pearl street, the second street in
importance from a business stand-
point, will shortly be paved to the
river bank below the court house,
and numerous other streets are be-
ing paved. Calder avenue, our well
