AS TO JOINT DISCUSSIONS.

Mr. Bryan declines to engage in a joint discussion of the tariff question with Senator Bailey, whereupon some of the senator's admirers are crowing lustily. They forget that only two weeks ago their idol side-stepped a challenge from Congressman Randall of the Fourth Texas district to meet him in a joint discussion of the question whether a servant of the people can at the same time serve an outlawed corporation, so that the best or the worst that can be said is that honors are even at that score.

But the truth is, Bailey did right in refusing to meet Randall and Bryan is equally right in declining to meet Bailey. Joint discussions are a relic of medieval dialectics, which Kant defined as "the logic of illusions," in which the disputants strive for victory without regard to truth. Political and religious joint discussions were popular when the prize ring, the cock-pit and similar brutal sports were in vogue and when a public man did not dare refuse a challenge to fight a duel. But all such semi-barbarous amusements for the public are condemned by the more enlightened public opinion of a higher civilization.

September has been a remarkable month of a very extraordinary year. Among its notable physical phenomena are two of the most destructive cyclones in history, a magnetic storm that put the telegraph wires of half a hemisphere out of business and the earthquake that caused the peaceful bosom of the great Mississippi valley to heave with unwonted commotion. Add to these the disturbed conditions in the political, religious, scientific and social departments of human activity, we have a most remarkable record.

The fact is, neither Bryan nor Bailey have advanced a single new thought or a bright idea on the tariff question. They are both threshing over old straw from which all the grain was winnowed years ago. The only point of real interest involved in the discussion is the obligation of a servant of the people to obey platform instructions.

If the farmers of Brazos county are wise they will hold their corn and use it economically. If there is anything in the law of supply and demand every bushel they can spare will be wanted at even higher prices than now prevail before another crop is made.

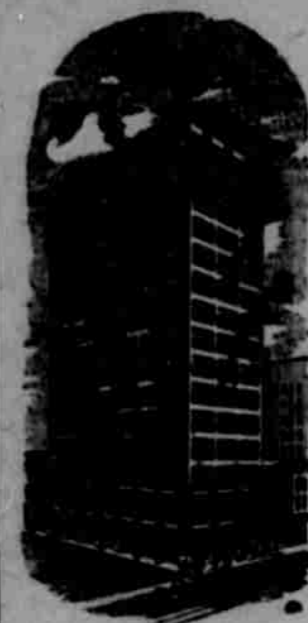
