**Cotton Ginned in Texas.**  
Austin, March 9.—The state department of agriculture has made public the report of the number of bales of cotton ginned for the season of 1908-9, which shows the total number to be 2,783,869, against 1,815,544 for the previous year. This number represents nine-tenths of the entire crop. It is expected the crop will reach 3,000,000, which, however, is below the government's figures.

**Nearly Two Thousand Reports Due.**  
Austin, March 9.—The secretary of state has announced that there are nearly 2,000 corporations thus far that have failed to make report of amount of stock outstanding and also amount of undivided profits. Several letters addressed to corporations at Houston, Dallas and Galveston were returned as the corporations were addressed to the general delivery and unopened for this does not excuse these corporations, however.

**DR. CHILDERS DEAD.**  
Pioneer Dallas Physician and Surgeon in the Confederate Army.  
Dallas, March 9.—At his residence in this city Dr. J. V. Childers, a citizen of Dallas since the early 70s, departed this life Tuesday morning. Dr. Childers, who was seventy-seven years of age, retired some years ago from active practice. During the civil war he was connected with the medical department of the Confederacy and was considered one of its most skilled surgeons.

**Why He Killed Himself.**  
Washington, March 9.—Heartbroken because his dream of having an intercontinental railroad open to the commerce of the fertile valleys of Central and South America had never materialized, Hinton Rowan Helper, former United States consul general at Buenos Ayres, committed suicide here. His wife and children live in Chicago.

**Can Entertain Thirty Thousand.**  
Fort Worth, March 9.—The Texas Cattlemen's association announces it is prepared to take care and entertain 30,000 visitors during the cattlemen's convention and stock show, which opens next week.

**T. C. Harry Passes Away.**  
Dallas, March 9.—T. C. Harry, a leading business man and long-time resident, succumbed to the effects of an appendicitis operation.

**The Magnetized Hat.**  
Borrow an old top hat and place it on the table crown uppermost; make a few passes over it; lay your hand upon the crown. Then gradually raise the hat in the air and make it float about in various positions. This is done by taking an ordinary black pin bent in the shape of the letter C, which you secrete in your right hand. On receiving the hat, take it in your left hand and while walking to the table put your right hand inside quickly and push the pin up through the crown. Make a few passes over the hat. Lay your left hand on the hat and slip your finger in the hook and lift the hat from the table. You can make the hat float in the air as if magnetized. The pin can easily be withdrawn when giving the hat back.

**Phosphorescent Flowers.**  
Many persons do not know that there are flowers and plants that give out a phosphorescent light in the dark. The nasturtium is one of them. The light of this flower is more noticeable after a day of strong sunlight. The marsh lily and the flaxinella also have the light. In the case of the flaxinella the phenomenon is due to a volatile oil that the plant secretes. It comes out in warm weather, spreads itself in a thin layer over the flowers and forms a vapor that becomes luminous in the dark. It is said that there is a kind of fungus in the coal mines near Dresden that has the appearance of luminous festoons of shifting colors.

**Fresh Blind Man's Buff.**  
The players form a ring, hand in hand, and the blind man stands in the middle, holding a stick or cane. The players dance around him till he raps on the floor, when they all stand perfectly still and silent. Then he holds out the cane, and the one toward whom it points must grasp the end. The blind man then asks any three questions he pleases, all of which must be answered in a changed voice. The blind man must guess who is talking. If he is right the two change places, but if he is wrong the players dance about him again and the game goes on.

**Dividend to Be Passed.**  
Hamburg, March 9.—The directors of the Hamburg American Steamship company propose to pass this year's dividend. A dividend of 6 per cent was paid last year.

### OLIVER CHOSEN.

#### Pittsburg Man Succeeds Knox in United States Senate.

Harrisburg, Pa., March 9.—George T. Oliver of Pittsburg was named by the Republican caucus of the legislature as its choice for the seat in the United States senate that Hon. Philander C. Knox resigned to accept the position of secretary of state in the cabinet of President Taft. Mr. Oliver is one of the leading citi-

zens of Pittsburg and one of the most prominent Republicans in the Keystone state. The nomination is equivalent to an election, as both houses are overwhelmingly Republican.

#### MOTIONS OVERRULED.

**Effect of Decision Expels Couple and Reinstates Waters-Pierce Company.**  
Jefferson City, Mo., March 9.—The motions by the Standard Oil Company of Indiana and the Republic Oil Company of Ohio for a rehearing of ouster suit recently decided against them and for modification of judgment were overruled by the Missouri supreme court.

The effect of these decisions is to expel the Indiana and Ohio companies from Missouri and to restore to the Waters-Pierce Oil company 60 per cent of whose stock is held by the Standard Oil company of New Jersey, the right to do business within the state.

No formal opinion was read, Chief Justice Valliant simply announcing the gist of the court's decision. Justices Lamm and Woodson dissented. The Standard Oil company's interests are expected to appeal and carry their case to the supreme court of the United States.

**Two-Cent Fare Legislation Ends.**  
Topeka, Kan., March 9.—The senate adopted the report of the railroad committee, which recommended that the 2 cent fare bill be not passed. This ends 2 cent fare legislation in the Kansas legislature at this session.

**Poorhouse Robbed.**  
Parkersburg, W. Va., March 9.—A large quantity of seed was stolen from the poorhouse.

Atlanta, March 9.—The executive committee of the Georgia Textile association issued a call for a meeting of all textile interests of the south here on March 16. The purpose of the meeting will be to consider the tariff and other important questions relative to the textile industry.

#### Hudspeth Arrested.

New Orleans, March 9.—Henry S. Hudspeth, former president of the New Orleans Typographical union, was arrested here charged with fraudulently obtaining money from the union. He was a candidate for the presidency of the International Typographical union against James M. Lynch during the election last May.

#### Expires in Bathtub.

Georgetown, Tex., March 9.—James Carter, aged forty-three, a farmer, was found dead in a bathtub at a local hotel early Tuesday morning. He came from Nacogdoches to buy land. It is believed heart disease caused his death.
