GROSS FRAUD BY PARR SUPPORTERS IS ALLEGED

Official notice that the Glasscock-Parr Senatorial contest is to be carried before the Texas Senate at the convening of the State legislature on January 14, was given yesterday when papers were served on Judge H. R. Sutherland, who, as Judge of Nueces County, is the returning officer for the Twenty-Third Senatorial District. Judge Sutherland was requested to forward the papers, consisting of about fifteen typewritten sheets, to the clerk of the Senate, which request Judge Sutherland said he would gladly comply with.

The nature of the proceedings is that the petitioner, Judge Glasscock, sets forth that in the Democratic primary of last July 27 that he was legally nominated as State Senator over Archie Parr of Duval County, that on November 5 last, Glasscock was in reality elected as State Senator, but that through gross fraud and corruption, he was elected out of the election.

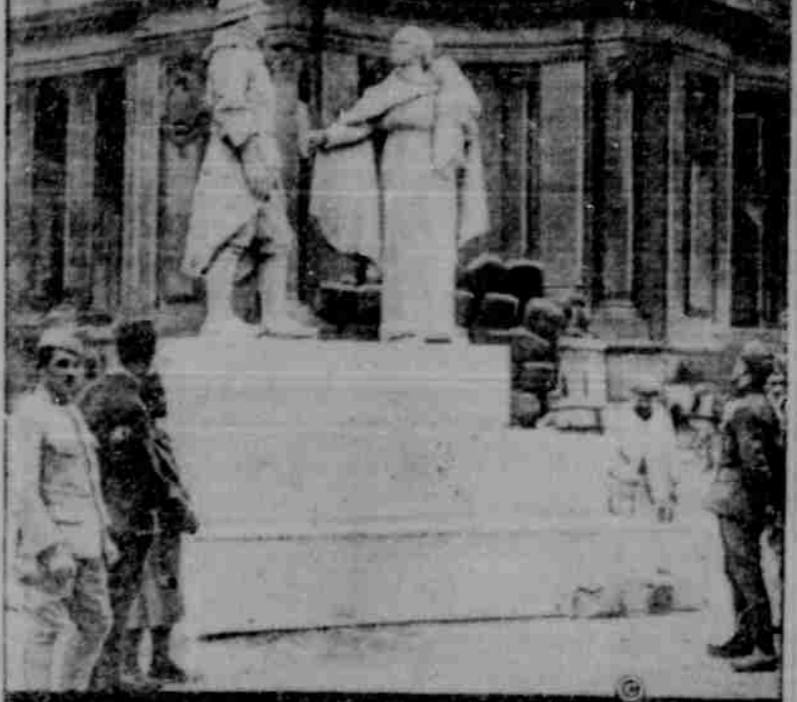
