The deceased was but 35 years old at the time of his death.

**Oil Mill Meeting.**

At the annual meeting of the stockholders of the Shiner Oil Mill & M'g Co. held June 1st, Chas. Welhausen, E. F. Wolters, S. J. Young, Aug. Stephan and A. Freytag were elected directors, and at a subsequent meeting of the directors, E. F. Wolters was elected president, Chas. Welhausen, vice president; Phillip Welhausen, secretary and treasurer, and D. C. Daniel, business manager.

Considering the difficulties under which the mill operated the past season, the report of the manager was favorably received, but the stockholders received no earnings. It is to be hoped that the mill will get a liberal patronage from ginners and farmers the coming season. It is a home institution and interested more in the people about Shiner than one located in some other town or city.

Members of that faith are quite numerous in Gonzales, and a list of twenty-four prospective members was soon made up. The Inquirer is informed that at least fifteen additional names will be secured to begin with. The list has been left with Mr. D. W. Hays until Sunday evening, June 29, when a meeting for the purpose of perfecting the organization will be held in this city.—Gonzales Inquirer.

**Election Notice.**

Be it ordered by the board of trustees of Shiner Independent School District, that an election be held at the Fire company's house in the town of Shiner, Lavaca county, Texas, in said Shiner Independent School District, on the 21st day of June, 1904, to determine whether or not a special tax of twenty cents (20c) on the one hundred dollar property valuation upon all the taxable property in said Shiner Independent School District shall be annually levied and collected for the current year, and to be annually levied and collected hereafter until discontinued as provided by law, for the support and maintenance of the public free schools in said Shiner Independent School District. Mr. E. Baettler is hereby appointed judge of said election and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same. Only property tax payers as shown by the last assessment rolls who are qualified voters in said Shiner Independent School District shall be allowed to vote in said election. A copy of this order signed by the president of the board of trustees of said Shiner Independent School District shall serve as a proper notice of said election, and shall be posted up at three public places in said Shiner Independent School District, and shall be published in a newspaper in said Shiner Independent School District.
