

TROUBLE AT TRINITY.

A detachment of the Houston Light Guard, commanded by Capt. Geo. McCormick, was called on by the Governor to accompany Sheriff Chandler, of Trinity county, and assist him in guarding a negro prisoner who was under arrest for assaulting a young lady of that county. The negro was taken from the Houston jail and taken back to Trinity by train, and was there fully identified by the young lady. A mob then gathered and attempted to take the negro from the soldier guards but McCormick and his men retreated to a school-house, posted guards and refused to give up the prisoner, although confronted by several hundred well armed and determined men. Capt. McCormick wired the Governor, who sent out reinforcements from Houston which arrived just in time to relieve the tension. The prisoner was placed on a special train with the re-inforcements and taken to the state penitentiary for safe keeping, so the matter rests.
