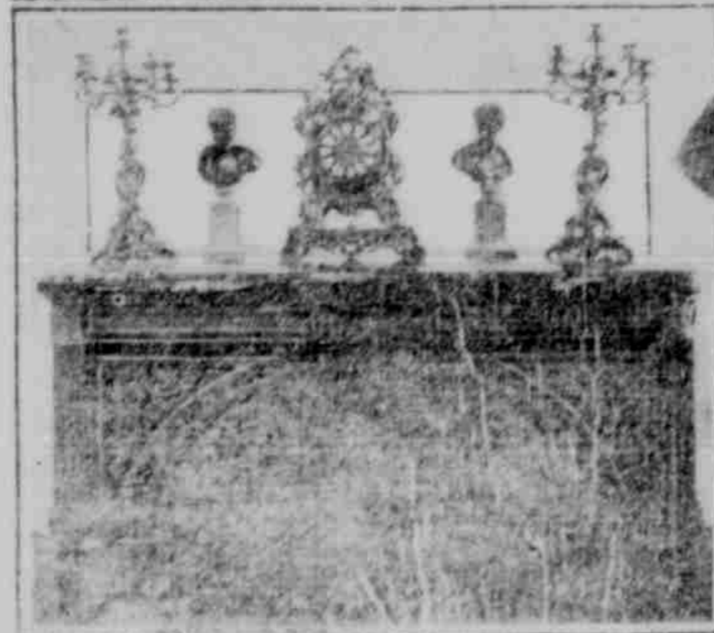
Lessons of Strife That
