NEW YORK CITY SHOWS ACTUAL BUILDING BOOM

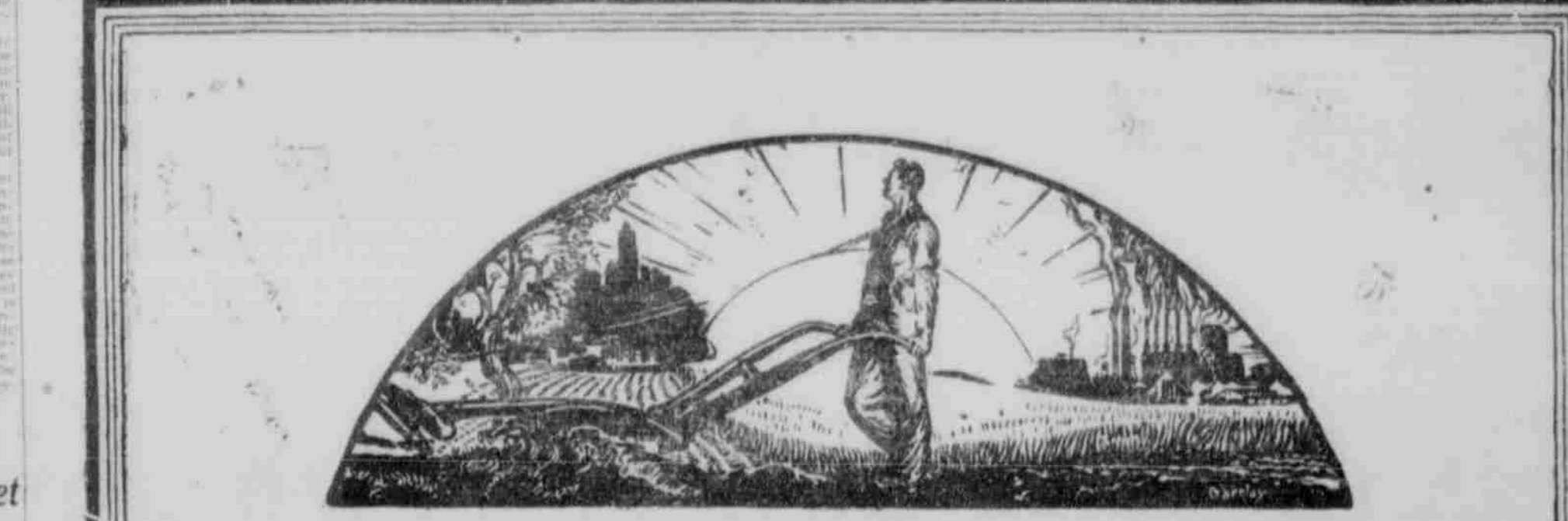
By The Associated Press. NEW YORK, March 20.—The first construction boom in some months has been observed in New York City today. The city is showing a marked increase in building activity.
