LITTLE ROCK, Ark., October 31.—Deser was yesterday visited by a fire which destroyed property of the total value of \$150,000.

A STRANGE EVENT.

A Mountain Springs Up in the Center of a Lake.

SAN FRANCISCO, November 1.—A letter published in this evening's Bulletin under date Opia, October 16th, says authentic news has reached Samoa that on the morning of September 10th, over 10 heavy earthquakes occurred on the island of Mifonef, one of the Tonga Group, and that from the bottom of the lake which had a depth of 2,000 feet a mountain has arisen to the height of 300 feet above its surface.
