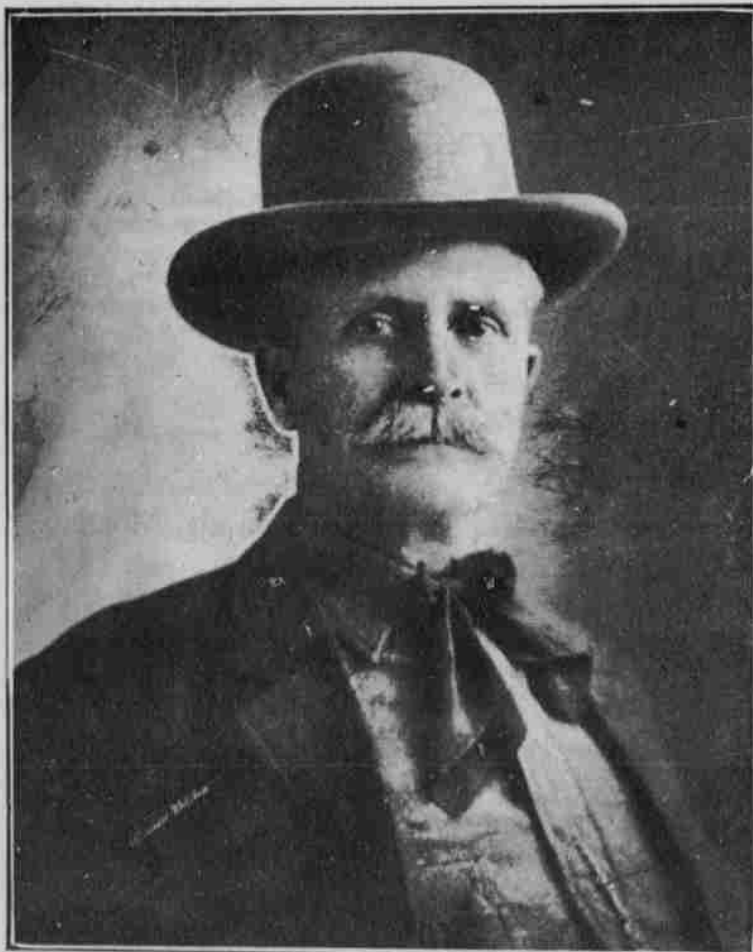




RENEE KELLY IN "DADDY LONG LEGS"
