AN ORDINANCE.

An ordinance levying a tax and providing for the assessment of property within the district bounded on the south by the north line of Third Avenue, on the west by the west line of A Street, on the north by the north line of Sixth Avenue, and on the east by the central line of Virginia Street, in Sewer District No. 1, for the construction of sewers.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah:

SECTION 1. That the City Council does hereby levy the tax and provide for the assessment of the same upon the property hereinafter described in Sewer District No. 1, for the construction of sewers, to-wit:

In Lots 3 and 4, Block 47; 3 and 4, Block 48; 1, 3 and 4, Block 49; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 50; 2, 3 and 4, Block 51; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 52; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 53; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 54; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 55; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 56; 1 and 2, Block 57; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 58; 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 59; 1 and 2, Block 60; 1 and 2, Block 61; 1 and 2, Block 62; 1 and 2, Block 63; 1 and 2, Block 64; 2 and 3, Block 65; all in Plat "D," abutting on both sides of Fourth Avenue between D and I Streets, on both sides of Fifth Avenue between D and I Streets, on both sides of Sixth Avenue between D and H Streets, on both sides of D Street between Fifth and Sixth Avenues, on both sides of E Street between Fourth and Sixth Avenues, on both sides of F Street between Fourth and Sixth Avenues, on both sides of G Street between Third and Sixth Avenues, on both sides of H Street between Third and Fifth Avenues, and on both sides of I Street between Fourth and Fifth Avenues.

This tax is levied to defray the expense of constructing vitrified pipe sewers eight (8) inches in diameter upon the portions of said streets opposite the property hereinafter described and hereinafter described to be especially affected and benefited by said improvement, and it is hereby adjudged, determined and established that said property will be especially benefited thereby to the full amount of the tax hereby levied, and said parcels of land are hereby assessed at an equal and uniform rate in accordance with the linear foot frontage upon said portions of said streets fronting upon and to a depth of twenty-five (25) feet back therefrom, and the tax hereby levied and to be assessed upon said parcels of land is sixteen thousand three hundred seventy-six and 89/100 (\$16,376.89) dollars, or one and 917926/10,000,000 (\$1.0917926) dollars per front or linear foot of abutting property for sewer on said portions of the streets above mentioned in Sewer District No. 1, there being 15,000 feet of abutting property within the boundaries of the lots, blocks and streets above mentioned, which is the total cost and cost per front foot of said sewer, according to the contract entered into for the performance of said work and making said improvement, with Davis & Heuser, dated the 4th day of May, 1905, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to assess in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance for the purpose herein mentioned:

Fronting on Fourth Avenue.
The north side of Lots 3 and 4, Block 47; the north side of Lot 3, the west 140 feet of the north side of Lot 4, Block 48; the east 140 feet of the north side of Lot 3, the north side of Lot 4, Block 49; the north side of Lots 3 and 4, Block 50; the north side of Lots 3 and 4, Block 51; the south side of Lots 1 and 2, Block 52; the south side of Lots 1 and 2, Block 53; the south side of Lot 1, Block 54; the east 140 feet of the south side of Lot 2, Block 55; the west 140 feet of the south side of Lot 1; the south side of Lot 2, Block 56; the south side of Lots 1 and 2, Block 57, Plat "D."

Fronting on Fifth Avenue.

Fronting on Sixth Avenue.

Fronting on D Street.

Fronting on F Street.
The south 140 feet of the east side of Lot 4, Block 65; the south 140 feet of the west side of Lot 3, Block 64; the south 140 feet of the east side of Lot 4, Block 66; the north 140 feet of the east side of Lot 1, Block 67; the north 140 feet of the west side of Lot 2, the south 140 feet of the west side of Lot 3, Block 77, Plat "D."

Fronting on G Street.
The north 140 feet of the east side of Lot 1, the south 140 feet of the east side of Lot 4, Block 49; the south 140 feet of the west side of Lot 3, the north 140 feet of the west side of Lot 2, Block 50; the north 140 feet of the east side of Lot 1, the south 140 feet of the east side of Lot 4, Block 64; the south 140 feet of the west side of Lot 3, the north 140 feet of the west side of Lot 2, Block 63; the north 140 feet of the east side of Lot 1, the south 140 feet of the east side of Lot 4, Block 67; the south 140 feet of the west side of Lot 3, the north 140 feet of the west side of Lot 2, Block 78, Plat "D."

Fronting on I Street.
The north 140 feet of the east side of Lot 1, the south 140 feet of the east side of Lot 4, Block 62; the south 140 feet of the west side of Lot 3, the north 140 feet of the west side of Lot 2, Block 61, Plat "D." Salt Lake City Survey, as the same are shown upon the official plats of said City to a depth of twenty-five (25) feet back from said streets, and to collect said tax.

SECTION 2. Said tax shall become and be delinquent in five equal installments, as follows, to-wit: One-fifth thereof one year after the approval of the ordinance confirming the levy of the tax for the payment for such improvement; one-fifth thereof in two years after such approval; one-fifth thereof in three years after such approval; one-fifth thereof in four years after such approval; and one-fifth thereof in five years after such approval. One or more of said installments, or the whole tax may be paid on or before ten days after the approval of the ordinance confirming the levy of the tax. One or more installments, or the whole special tax may be paid on the day any installment becomes due by paying the amount thereof and interest to date of payment. Each of said installments shall bear interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum from the date of the approval of the ordinance confirming the levy of said tax until date of delinquency, and eight (8) per cent per annum from delinquency until paid.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon approval.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah:

SECTION 1. That the assessment list made by the City Treasurer, as corrected, approved and completed by the Board of Equalization and Review, heretofore duly appointed by the City Council for that purpose, of the property in Lots 1 and 2, Block 73, Plat "A," 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 63, and 5, 6, 7 and 8, Block 53, Plat "B," abutting on the north side of First South Street between Second East and Fourth East Streets, and on the south side of First South Street between Sixth East and Seventh East Streets, in Paving District No. 27, of Salt Lake City, for the purpose of providing for the grading, guttering and curbing, and paving of said portion of said street, is hereby confirmed, and the assessments made and returned in said completed lists are hereby confirmed.
