

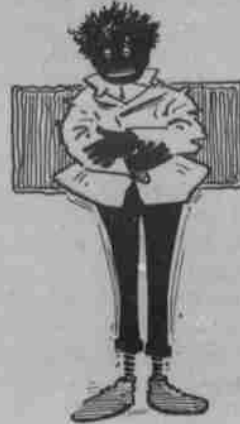
When you order chocolates just say--
