LEGAL NOTICES.

AN ORDINANCE.

An ordinance levying a tax and for the assessment of property within the following described limits: Beginning at the center of Seventh East and Ninth South Streets, thence south along the center line of Seventh East Street to the center of Belmont Avenue, thence east along the center line of Belmont Avenue to the center of Eighth East Street, thence south along the center line of Eighth East Street to the center of Herbert Avenue, thence east along the center line of Herbert Avenue to the center of Windsor Street, thence south along the center line of Windsor Street to a point 172.24 feet south of the south side of Herbert Avenue, thence east to the center of Ninth East Street, thence south along the center line of Ninth East Street to a point 254.1 feet south of the south side of Herbert Avenue, thence east to the center of Tenth East Street, thence north along the center line of Tenth East Street to the center of Ninth South Street, thence west along the center line of Ninth South Street to the center line of Seventh East Street, the place of beginning, in Sewer District No. 1, for the construction of sewers.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah:

SECTION 1. That the City Council does hereby levy the tax and provide for the assessment of the same upon the property hereinafter described in Sewer District No. 1, for the construction of sewers, to-wit:

In Lots 7 to 16, inclusive, Block 2; 7 to 24, inclusive, Block 1, Hampton's Subdivision, Block 18, Five Acre Plat "A," Lot 12, Block 18; 21 and 22, Block 3; 21, Block 4, Belmont Subdivision, Block 17; 1 to 10, inclusive, Block 2, North Windsor Subdivision, Block 18; 1 to 18, inclusive, Block 2, Windsor Subdivision, Block 18; 19 to 38, inclusive, Miller & Miller Subdivision, Block 18, all in Five Acre Plat "A," Big Field Survey, abutting on the south side of Ninth South Street between Seventh East and Tenth East Streets, on the east side of Seventh East Street between Ninth South Street and Belmont Avenue, on both sides of Lake Street between Ninth South Street and Belmont Avenue, the west side of Eighth East Street between Ninth South Street and Belmont Avenue, the east side of Eighth East Street between Belmont and Farley Avenues, the west side of Windsor Street between Ninth South Street and Farley Avenue.

This tax is levied to defray the expense of constructing vitrified pipe sewers eight (8), ten (10) and twelve (12) inches in diameter upon the portions of said streets opposite the property hereinafter and hereinafter described to be especially affected and benefited by said improvement, and it

is hereby adjudged, determined and established that said property will be especially benefited thereby to the full amount of the tax hereby levied, and said parcels of land are hereby assessed at an equal and uniform rate in accordance with the linear foot frontage upon said portions of said streets fronting upon and to a depth of twenty-five (25) feet back therefrom, and the tax hereby levied and to be assessed upon said parcels of land is six thousand one hundred three and 56-100 (\$6,103.56) dollars; two thousand seven hundred thirty-two and 91-100 (\$2,732.91) dollars, or one and 753554-1,000,000 (\$1,753.554) dollars per front or linear foot of abutting property for sewer on side of street, there being 1558.5 feet of abutting property within the boundaries of the lots, blocks and streets above mentioned in said district; and three thousand three hundred seventy and 65-100 (\$3,370.65) dollars, or \$74777-1,000,000 (\$3,876.777) dollars per front or linear foot of abutting property within the boundaries of the lots, blocks and streets above mentioned, which is the total cost and cost per front foot of said sewers according to the contract entered into for the performance of said work and making said improvement, with V. P. Strange, dated the 12th day of October, 1908, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to assess in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance for the purpose herein mentioned:

Sewer on Side of Street.
The east 173 feet of the north side of Lot 14, the north side of Lots 15 and 16, Block 2; the north side of Lots 14 to 17, inclusive, Block 1, Hampton's Subdivision, Block 18; the west 131.75 feet of the east 791 feet of the north side of Lot 12; the west 131.75 feet of the east 52.75 feet of the north side of Lot 12; the west 264 feet of the east 259 feet of the north side of Lot 12, Block 18; the east 132 feet of the north side of Lot 21, the west 132 feet of the north side of Lot 22, Block 3; the east 132 feet of the north side of Lot 21, Block 4, Belmont Subdivision Block 17, all in Five Acre Plat "A."

Sewer in Center of Street.
The west side of Lots 7 to 14, inclusive, the east side of Lots 17 to 23, inclusive, Block 2; the west side of Lots 7 to 13, inclusive, the east side of Lots 18 to 24, inclusive, Block 1, Hampton's Subdivision, Block 18; the west side of Lot 12, the east side of the west 339 feet of Lot 12, Block 18; the west side of Lots 2 to 6, inclusive, the east side of Lot 1, the east side of Lots 7 to 10, inclusive, Block 2, North Windsor Subdivision, Block 18; the west side of Lots 1 to 10, inclusive, the east side of Lot 1, the east side of Lots 11 to 18, inclusive, Block 2, Windsor Subdivision, Block 18; the east side of Lots 19 to 27, inclusive, the west side of Lots 28 to 35, inclusive, Miller & Miller Subdivision, Block 18, all in Five Acre Plat "A," Big Field Survey, as the same are shown upon the official plats of Salt Lake City to a depth of twenty-five (25) feet back from said streets, and to collect said tax.

SECTION 2. Said tax shall become and be delinquent in five equal installments, as follows, to-wit: One-fifth thereof one year after the approval of the ordinance confirming the levy of the tax for the payment for such improvement; one-fifth thereof in two years after such approval; one-fifth thereof in three years after such approval; one-fifth thereof in four years after such approval; and one-fifth thereof in five years after such approval. One or more of said installments, or the whole tax, may be paid on or before ten days after the approval of the ordinance confirming the levy of the tax. One or more installments, or the whole special tax may be paid on the day any installment becomes due by paying the amount thereof and interest to date of payment. Each of said installments shall bear interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum from the date of the approval of the ordinance confirming the levy of said tax until date of delinquency, and eight (8) per cent per annum from delinquency until paid.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon approval.
