**AN ORDINANCE.**

An ordinance amending and re-enacting Section 736 of the Revised Ordinances of Salt Lake City of 1903.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah:

SECTION 1. That Section 736 of the Revised Ordinances of Salt Lake City of 1903, be, and the same hereby is, amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

736. ASSISTANTS. APPOINTMENT. COMPENSATION. The Supervisor of Streets shall have the power to appoint, during the term for which he is appointed, subject to confirmation by the Council, a chief clerk at a salary of twelve hundred dollars per annum, and a poll tax collector at a salary of nine hundred dollars per annum, such salaries to be payable monthly, as are the salaries of other city employees. The Supervisor of Streets shall also have power to employ foremen, stablemen, engineers, laborers and teams in such manner and at such compensation as the necessities of his office may demand, and the City Council authorize.

SECTION 2. All ordinances and resolutions or parts of ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon approval.
